Starting out with zero knowledge about the English language, his relentless efforts and dedication earned him the status of a first-class student. Today, by the grace of God, he speaks fluent English with confidence. Join us as we dive into his incredible journey!"



Tell us about your family.

I was born to Mr. Joseph and Mrs. Valarmathi in Yakobupuram, a small village in the Tirunelveli district. We are a Christian family, and I have three brothers. My mom raised us to regularly attend church from a young age, but honestly, I had no personal connection with Jesus at that time.

What a lovely family! Now, can you share a bit about your childhood and school life?

As a kid, I was obsessed with playing games on laptops and watching TV, so I wasn't really interested in studies until the 9th grade. That's when my teacher warned us, "Only those who pass all subjects will make it to 10th grade." I was terrified because I was really bad at English and Math. English lessons always feel unpleasant. I had no clue what to do and began seeking Jesus. I prayed, "Jesus, you're the



only one who can save me." At the same time, I had this sweet elderly woman named Mabel in my neighbourhood, who was always kind and full of faith. When I shared my struggles with her, she advised, "If you write it down once, it's like reading it ten times." So I began writing things down and praying more earnestly.

How did seeking Jesus and following her advice change things for you?

English was tough for me, but I started writing things down, memorising, and studying hard. Even then, I struggled with spelling mistakes. Every time I had an exam, I asked Grandma Mabel to pray for me. 5



Slowly, I quit gaming and TV and started reading the Bible. As I read more, I felt this growing confidence. Before, I doubted if I could even pass the 10th grade, but God gave me freedom from that insecurity. I ended up scoring 371 in the 10th grade and 312 in the 12th grade. It wasn't by my ability; it was purely God's grace!

That's amazing! You worked so hard and succeeded in school. What happened next in college?

After finishing 12th, God helped me get into a BBA Aviation Management course at a university in Chennai, where I needed at least 50% marks to qualify. I got 52%, and it was nothing short of a miracle. I trusted the vision God gave me, saying, 'I will place you in a good job,' and with that faith, I enrolled in this course at a prestigious university. But everything was in English, and I wasn't proficient at it. In order to study at this college, I would need to pay one and a half lakh in tuition fees and an additional lakh for hostel fees. Because of this, my parents were worried and asked, "Can you really do this?" I told my parents, "lesus will surely fulfil what He revealed to me in the vision. No matter what, I will endure the struggle and complete my studies." With that assurance, they paid my college fees and sent me off. The first three or four months were incredibly tough. I had no knowledge of English at all, while everyone in my class spoke only it. I couldn't speak or read the language. Whenever I tried to converse in English with my classmates,


they would mock me. Each time that happened, my heart would break, and I would return to my room at night, pouring out my tears in prayer to Jesus. Six months passed, and the first-semester exams were approaching. Determined, I pushed myself to prepare rigorously for the tests, despite the difficulties I faced.

How did you handle the exams and challenges in college? Did you pass all your subjects?

At first, I didn't know how to tackle the exams, but my dad got me an ESV English Bible, thinking it would be easier for me to understand. Even then, I couldn't grasp it. That's when I prayed, and God guided me to use Google Translate to learn. I started watching grammar classes on YouTube, reading newspapers, and more. It was hard, but I didn't give up. One day, overwhelmed with a heavy heart, I prayed, pouring out my tears in the presence of the Lord, and then I opened the Bible and began reading small verses, starting with the very first one: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." It was at that moment I started to grasp the concept of grammar. To be honest, reading the Bible taught me the basics of grammar. Not only that, but Jesus also blessed me with friends who spoke fluent English. By listening to their conversations, I gradually picked up the language, thanks to God's grace. In my first semester, I didn't have a full understanding of everything, and I didn't ace my exams easily. I diligently studied what little I knew, memorised it with great effort, and succeeded in passing. However, I did face one setback: I received an arrear in one subject. But I rewrote the exam in the following semester and passed it successfully.

Wow, after all that hard work, you graduated! What are you doing now?

Though I knew no English, I chose to study that particular degree simply because Jesus prompted me to. By God's grace, I scored a perfect centum in the Air Ticketing and Fare



Construction subject during my final semester. Jesus granted me wisdom, blessed me, and allowed me to graduate as a first-class student with a certificate, completing my college degree in 2021 with a good reputation. After graduation, I went through six months without a job, attending numerous interviews. Despite passing all the rounds, I ultimately failed to secure a job. I prayed earnestly to Jesus, saying, "Lord, it was You who guided me to pursue this course, and I have completed it. Even if I can't find a job related to my field, please grant me at least a small job." In the seventh month. I attended another interview and was finally selected. By God's grace, I secured a job in line with my field of study, working at the Chennai Airport. I currently work as a Customer Service Executive at Chennai the International Airport. True to His promise, the Lord has elevated me to a position where interact fluently in English with high-ranking officials, **LEAIR** foreigners, dignitaries from other states, and even cricket and film celebrities.

Among thousands, Jesus really lifted me to heights I never imagined.

That's incredible. In the beginning, there was no connection between you and Jesus. Now that God has lifted you up, how do you reflect on your journey?

Although I occasionally read the Bible, prayed, and attended church, it was only during my 12th grade that I truly accepted lesus as my personal saviour and dedicated my entire life to Him. From the day I gave myself to the Lord, I developed a profound love and devotion toward Him. Since then, God has graciously granted me many visions that have strengthened my faith. He guided me beautifully through my school years, helping me to finish successfully. During my college days, many of my friends fell into sinful habits, but lesus protected me, keeping me away from such temptations. Because I surrendered my life completely to Him, the Lord shielded me from all harm, leading me according to His divine will. Looking back, I praise God every single day for His goodness.

Great..! What advice would you like to give the youth?

• First, you must commit yourself to God. Don't just seek Jesus when you need something—build a daily connection with Him. He already knows what you require.

• Second, tell God your struggles. I told him I was bad at English, and he blessed me with the wisdom to speak fluently with foreigners today.

• Third, align yourself with God's plan for you and work hard towards it. No matter how impossible things seem, he will make a way for you.

Dear young people! Brother Ajith devoted himself to God, laid his weaknesses before Him, and surrendered to His will. Today, God has made him shine brightly. Are you feeling down, wondering if you'll ever shine too? Bring your struggles to God. He will make you shine, just like he did with Ajith!

- Eventually, you might find yourself questioning, "Is this kind of life even worth it?" and be tempted to make a wrong decision.



In the Bible, Daniel stands out as someone who prayed passionately for his people to be freed from captivity. His unwavering prayers and the answers he received from God are recorded in the Scriptures (Daniel 9:20–23). Before diving into his prayer and its answers, let's first explore a few things about Daniel this month.



King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon invaded Jerusalem, capturing and burning it down. He took some of the brightest and most gifted young men as captives, intending to train them for his kingdom's service. Daniel was among these captives, likely around 18 years old when he was taken from Jerusalem to Babylon.

Yet Daniel never questioned God. Living in a foreign land, Daniel had a solid conviction: he resolved not to defile himself with the royal food and wine, and he asked the chief official

for permission not to defile himself this way (Daniel 1:8). Despite God's favour upon him, Daniel remained firm in his decision, saying, "I will not defile myself" and "I will not displease God."




Daniel had the remarkable habit of praying three times a day, kneeling before God, and

offering thanksgiving (Daniel 6:10). This routine wasn't about praying whenever he found time; it was about maintaining a disciplined prayer life.

He would open his windows toward Jerusalem and pray at set times each day. Daniel never skipped his prayer time. His determination to keep his heart pure and his commitment to regular prayer were unwavering.

DANIEL'S FAITH-FILLED PRAYER



Daniel's faith was deeply rooted. Even when he was thrown into the lion's den, his faith in God to shut the mouths of the lions didn't waver (Daniel 6:23). Like Daniel, we, too, should possess a faith that boldly confronts any evil, knowing that the God within us is greater than any force in the world.



Although Daniel often prayed alone, he also had prayer partners—Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, the young men brought from Jerusalem with him. When faced with a critical situation—interpreting the king's dream— Daniel joined his friends in prayer, and God revealed the meaning that very night (Daniel 2:17–19). Just as Daniel had prayer companions, you should also build a circle of friends who will join you in praying for the nation and souls.

Dear young people, Daniel's commitment to praying three times daily kept him pure. He had prayer partners. When you unite in prayer, you, too, can rise as a mighty prayer warrior, just like Daniel! Amen!

Hey Friends! For the past few months, we've been exploring the traps that the devil sets to drag us into hell. Last month, we learnt about being born of water and spirit. This month we're delving into another snare that Satan uses—fear.

FEAR

When you read the word 'fear,' do you feel like skipping to the next page to avoid any trouble? Hold on! Read on, and you'll see a big change in your life. The Bible calls fear a sin. We all face different kinds of fears: some fear being alone, some fear the dark, heights, blood, sudden loud noises, or when family members don't come home on time. For some, it's the fear of exams, marriage, their children, or the future. Some fear death, and others fear accidents while travelling.

Fear creeps in when unexpected things happen. In these last days, the events we hear about wars, famines, and plagues—seem designed to make us afraid. But Jesus says we shouldn't fear these things: "When you hear of wars and uprisings, do not be frightened" (Luke 21:9).

WHO SHOULDN'T WE FEAR?

The Bible tells us, "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body, and after that, you can do no more" (Luke 12:4). In other words, don't fear people. Many of us worry about what others will think, even when doing the right thing. For example, as Christians, we hesitate to share the gospel in public places, fearing what others might think or do. But fear of man will prove to be a snare (Proverbs 29:25).

Although fear is normal, dwelling on it can be harmful, as it can lead to other sins.



CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING EXAMPLES FROM THE BIBLE

• King Saul sinned because he feared people (I Samuel 15:24).

 Later, that same Saul, out of fear, took his own life (I Samuel 31:4).

Peter, terrified on the Mount of Transfiguration, spoke without knowing what he was saying (Mark 9:6).

 The same Peter denied Jesus because he feared for his life (Matthew 26:69–74).

Fear comes from the devil. It causes pain, robs sleep, damages health, and affects our happiness, studies, work, and entire life. Satan, our adversary, uses fear to trap and paralyse us. Fear doesn't just affect us in this life; it can keep us from eternal joy. "The cowardly... will be consigned to the fiery



lake of burning sulfur. This is the second death" (Revelation 21:8).

BIBLICAL COUNSEL ON FEAR

• The Bible says, "You did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, "Abba Father."(Romans 8:15).

• God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind (2 Timothy 1:7).

Dear brothers and sisters reading this! Perhaps you're struggling with fear, losing sleep, crying in silence, or feeling trapped. Breaking free from fear is crucial. If you stay in fear, it can turn into anxiety, and anxiety can lead you down a dangerous path, even to suicide. In order to set you free, Jesus defeated the devil on the cross(Hebrews 2:14–15).

Satan loves those who live in fear. That's why he works so hard to keep us in his snare, dragging us toward hell. So be vigilant; don't give fear a foothold; and, with the help of the Holy Spirit, overcome it and escape eternal punishment.

burning and shining lamp" (John 5:35).



As young people, we're navigating a world full of fierce competition. Each day brings us a new set of challenges. Amidst all this, we experience a range of emotions, especially when it comes to negative feelings like fear, loneliness, anger, hatred, and stress. If you're dealing with any of these, this section is for you!

When we talk about cravings, we're referring to that uncontrollable, intense desire or longing for a particular thing or food. In simple terms, cravings are powerful urges that can sometimes pull us into unhealthy habits.

For example:

You might suddenly crave a midnight biryani.





At certain times, you may feel the need to smoke or drink.

Some may want to buy that new bike or car you've been eyeing.



In this section, we'll explore how to control these overpowering cravings.

"Wait, so you're saying I shouldn't have any desires? Aren't worldly things meant to be enjoyed? Why shouldn't I want to buy my dream bike or car, or go out with friends and try varieties of food?" Do questions like these cross your mind?

Dear youth! Desires aren't necessarily bad. But when these desires turn into cravings and start overshadowing your love for Christ, that's where the problem begins.

Desires for substances such as tobacco, late-night meals, alcohol, or material possessions can lead to specific changes in your body and mind, including:

- Mood Swings
- Increased heart rate
- High blood pressure





Simple Ways to Tackle

Go for a walk, Learn a new skill or art, Swim or engage in sports, Spend quality time with family, Bond with friends who pray with you, Increase your personal prayer time. Engaging in meaningful activities will make it easier to manage your cravings.

BIBLICAL GUIDANCE

• Instead of relying on your own strength, lean on the Lord's power and pray to overcome cravings (Philippians 4:13).

• Renew your mind with the Word of God to resist worldly desires (Romans 12:2). Stay connected to God through prayer, worship, and Bible reading, and practice self-control as the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22–23).

> Understand that cravings stem from a deeper need or emptiness and find true satisfaction in God (Psalm 107:9).

• Fast and pray to discipline your body, allowing your spirit to gain strength and overcome cravings (Matthew 6:16–18).

Dear young hearts reading this, make a firm decision to say "NO" to anything that seeks to enslave you. Stand firm in your decision. Whether you become a slave to cravings or master them is entirely up to you. Remember, you are not slaves—you are children of the King!

• Avoid situations that trigger cravings and trust that God will help you overcome temptation (1 Corinthians 10:13).

Paul penned the second letter to Timothy in 67 A.D., during his final days, while imprisoned in a dark dungeon for the third time. What makes this letter special is that it was written solely for Timothy, whom Paul considered his spiritual son.

Objective

Knowing that his time of death was near, Paul longed to

In this letter, Paul addresses Timothy as his beloved son twice. He also refers to him as a man of sincere faith, someone who has known the scriptures since childhood, and identifies him as a true servant of God. Isn't that amazing, friends? Even as a young man, Timothy received such glowing praise from the great apostle Paul. We should reflect on whether others could identify us this way today.

Paul's Instructions

Paul encourages Timothy to fan into flame the gift of God that he received through the

laying on of hands. He urges Timothy to hold onto the sound teachings he received and to stand firm in them. Paul also advises Timothy to stay strong in the face of suffering.

Warnings to Timothy

• Paul warns Timothy three times to be cautious of people

like Phygelus and Alexander, who stumbled in their ministry due to hardships and worldly desires.

• He also cautions Timothy to stay away from false teachers and instructs him to preach the truth with patience and clarity, avoiding useless arguments and empty chatter.

• Paul urges Timothy to flee from youthful desires and preach the Word with diligence, whether the time is favourable or not.

• He also says that Timothy must keep a clear mind, stay committed to the work of an evangelist, and faithfully complete his ministry.

• He advises to be cautious regarding those who have stumbled in their ministry."

The strategy to deal with false teachings

Paul advises Timothy to avoid getting caught up in debates about false teachings. Instead, he encourages Timothy to instruct others

wisely before God, with clear teaching of the truth, patiently enduring wrongs, and gently guiding those who oppose the truth, hoping they will come to know it. Paul emphasizes the importance of Timothy continuing in the ministry and fighting the good fight, just as Paul himself has done—finishing the race triumphantly before the Lord Jesus Christ while keeping his faith intact.

Paul, who sees Timothy as his own spiritual son, expresses a deep desire to see him soon, urging Timothy to visit before winter sets in. He also asks Timothy to bring the cloak Paul left behind, along with some books and scrolls. This letter is known as the second letter Paul wrote to Timothy, and it is often considered Paul's final letter before his death.

Whoa! Though there are only four chapters in this letter, look at the amount of wisdom Paul packed into it for Timothy! The advice, warnings, and instructions he gave him are truly mind-blowing. And because Timothy listened closely, reflected on it all, and acted on it, he became an unshakeable servant of God. Paul faced countless hardships in his ministry, and Timothy, along with other workers, knew all about them. Some stumbled along the way. But Timothy, even as a young man, stood firm. Isn't that an incredible feat?

Dear friends! This letter isn't just for Timothy. This letter is also intended for us, particularly for those of us in our youth. In these days when false teachings are everywhere, with some saying, "If you follow God, you'll only receive blessings without any hardships," are we ready to stand firm like Timothy? Are we prepared to endure challenges in ministry? Let's reflect on these warnings and advice and apply them to our lives.

Youth Trends October 2024



Millions of people have lost their employment worldwide just in the last six months. This year, the tech sector alone has laid off 124,000 people. 34 companies laid off 8,000 employees in July 2024. Experts predict these layoffs will continue in the coming days. The cessation of salaries has forced many into debt, leading to significant emotional distress. Over the last seven years, 3.7 million small businesses have shut down, resulting in 13.4 million job losses.

Maharashtra has the highest divorce rate at 18.7%, followed by Karnataka (11.7%), Uttar Pradesh (8.8%), West Bengal (8.2%), and Delhi (7.7%). Tamil Nadu ranks sixth with a divorce rate of 7.1%.

It is everyone's hope that tranquillity will return, and those who fled will one day return to their homeland, living without fear and in harmony.

As I reflect on this situation, a biblical event comes to mind. During the reign of Jehoiakim, the King of Judah, the Lord delivered the people of Israel into the hands of Nebuchadnezzar, the king of Babylon. Daniel, one of those taken from Jerusalem to Babylon, stood firm in his devotion to God, never compromising his faith, even in a foreign land. His unwavering belief not only saved him but led King Darius to acknowledge the Lord as the true God. Darius declared that everyone in his kingdom should fear and revere the God of Daniel, the living God, the Saviour.

In the same way, beloved Daniel—despite being a captive—sparked a revival in the land where Darius reigned. Today, despite the chaos in Manipur and the scattering of its people, I believe that the locals and officials in these areas will witness the faithful actions of God's children and come to accept Him as their Savior. 

YOKING WITH UNBELIEVERS

But when their lifestyles, beliefs, and worship habits differ, it creates strain—not just for the couple but also with God, who desires unconditional devotion from His children. If living at odds with people makes life feel unsafe, imagine the danger of opposing the God who created the heavens, the earth, and the entire universe. What hope remains for a truly good life when we cling to worldly desires and drift away from Him?




