I was born as the third child to Mr. Sivasubramanian and Mrs. Shanmuga Kani in the village of Duraisamypuram, located in Tamil Nadu's Thoothukudi district. I have two elder sisters. From birth, I was completely blind.

I began my schooling in a regular institution where normal students studied, completing my education there from Grade I to Grade 5. It was only after this that I learnt about the School for the Blind in Palayamkottai, Tirunelveli district. In 2009, I enrolled there to continue my studies.

Upon my arrival, I was introduced to Braille, the script used by the visually impaired. How-

I come from a family that has never known Jesus. It was only after joining this school that I first heard about the Lord Jesus Christ. As a child, I had no faith in temples or religious practices. But when I learnt about Jesus, an unexplainable curiosity and a sense of trust began to grow in me. I felt drawn to Him and started

praying. As days passed, I turned to Jesus for everything I needed, asking Him for even the smallest things. And to my amazement, He answered my prayers, blessing me step by step.

That's wonderful! We've learnt about your childhood and family background. Now, tell us about your education?

From my very first year of school until I completed my studies, I consistently ranked first in my class. In 2018, as I prepared for my 10thgrade board exams, I attended an Achievers' Meeting held for students. Inspired by the event, I prayed earnestly, asking God to help me secure the top rank. But when the results were announced, my expectations were shattered—I placed seventh in my school.

At that time, I couldn't understand why God had not granted my request. Disappointed and disheartened, I slowly began to resent Him. My passion for studies also started fading, and by the time I reached I I th grade, my performance had dropped—I secured only the second rank. In 2020, while I was in my 12th grade, I once again attended the Achievers gathering and prayed fervently. The Lord heard my prayers and blessed me with 521 marks out of 600, making me the top



scorer in my school. By His grace, I was also granted the opportunity to pursue a Bachelor's degree in English at a college in Madurai.

However, my journey was not without trials. While still in college, I had to endure the painful loss of my father and face several hardships. Yet, Jesus never abandoned me. He sustained me and enabled me to continue my studies. Though certain dreams I cherished slipped away, He placed a deep passion for cricket within me and led me to new heights in the sport. Not only that, but through Good Samaritan, I received immense support, which proved to be a great blessing in my life.

Despite many normal students taking education for granted, you pursued a degree. You also spoke about how cricket elevated you. How did your passion for cricket begin?

At the school for the visually impaired, academics were taught alongside sports. I was naturally drawn to sports and eagerly began playing. I was particularly fascinated by blind cricket and was determined to master it.

One day, I overheard one of my teachers reading a newspaper article about the Indian Blind Cricket Team winning the World Cup. That moment sparked a dream within me—I, too,



wanted to represent India in blind cricket. Without hesitation, I turned to my teacher and said, "With God by my side, I will one day play for India. And when that happens, you will read about it in the newspaper." What seemed impossible at the time became a reality much sooner than I had imagined, purely by God's grace. The most astonishing part was that I eventually got the chance to play alongside a player I had once read about in the newspapers as a child!

By the time I completed college, I had the opportunity to participate in the national selections for the Indian Blind Cricket Team. I trained rigorously and performed well in the trials. Initially playing under the Tamil Nadu Blind Association, I later got a call from the Cricket Association for the Blind in India for the national team selection. By God's grace, my performance secured me a place in the Indian team—just as I had once declared in faith!

Not only that, but in 2023, I was selected for the Indian team for the first time and had the privilege of competing in a world-class tournament held in England, where we won a silver medal. Today, I serve as a senior official, holding the position of Labour Welfare Officer at Tamil Nadu Salt Corporation. Looking back, our family once struggled to make ends meet with a monthly income of just ten thousand rupees. But the Lord has lifted us to heights we never could have imagined!



What is your message to young people? Those who trust in the Lord are never forsaken! Put your faith in Jesus, and He will elevate you to great heights. But remember, faith must be accompanied by effort—you must strive, work hard, and stay committed. Success and failure are in God's hands, but when you dedicate time to Him and follow Jesus wholeheartedly, He will surely lift you up!

falsely accused, and imprisoned. Stripped of everything, he stood at his lowest—but God exalted him to the highest position next to Pharaoh in Egypt.

Even today, the same God is still working wonders. As you prepare for your exams, He looks at you and declares victory over your efforts. But just as God granted success to Daniel, there were certain qualities that set him apart. Those same virtues must be found in you as well (Daniel 6:4).

Greetings to all the dear young people in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ! Last month, we explored the construction of the Tabernacle, including its structure, interior, and dimensions. This month, let's focus on its important part: the Holy Place and what it contains.

The Holy Place

To enter the Holy Place, one must first pass through the first curtain. This curtain, much like the entrance to the Tabernacle, is adorned with intricate designs in blue, red, and purple. The Levites were not allowed to enter; if they attempted to do so, they would surely die. Only the ordained priests are allowed to enter.

I. THE BREAD OF THE PRESENCE AND THE TABLE

Upon entering the Holy Place, on the north side, to the right, there will be the Table of the Bread of the Presence, made of acacia wood and overlaid with gold. (Exodus - 37:10-16)

• There will be 12 unleavened loaves of bread arranged on the table, with 6 loaves on each side.

• These loaves are holy; only the priests are permitted to eat them (Leviticus 24:9).

• The loaves must be replaced every seven days.

2. GOLDEN LAMPSTAND

Opposite the table, to the left, on the south, there will be a golden lampstand. (Exodus 37:17-21).

• The sun's rays do not reach the fully enclosed tabernacle; therefore, the light from the lampstand is the primary source of illumination in the Holy Place.

• The lampstand is crafted from a single shaft and features seven branches: three on the right, three on the left, and one in the centre.

- This lamp must remain lit at all times.
- The High Priest is responsible for maintaining it by pouring in oil and replacing the wicks.

3. THE ALTAR OF INCENSE

The Altar of Incense in the Holy Place is a small altar made of wood and covered with gold. It is also called the golden altar. (Exodus 40:26, 27).

• The priest will burn incense in it, and the Holy Place will be filled with the fragrant smoke that rises from it.

• Then the high priest must pass through this curtain to enter the Most Holy Place.

The veil between the Holy Place and the Most Holy Place

This second curtain separates the Holy Place from the Most Holy Place.

- This is the veil found in the Temple of Jerusalem.
- Notably, when Jesus died on the cross, this veil was torn from top to bottom.

How to enter the **Most Holy Place?**

• The high priest could only enter the Most Holy Place once a year to sprinkle goat blood on the mercy seat as a sin offering. (Exodus 26:31-33).

 If a priest enters the Most Holy Place without proper preparation and fails to follow God's instructions, he will die immediately.

Hope everyone has got a basic understanding of the Holy Place of the Tabernacle and its significance.

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Missionary Biography: William

Seeds Of Revival

>>>>

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Young people living in the final hour of revival! The sacrifices of the early missionaries and their lives of dedication left a profound impact wherever they went. With no permanent shelter, lacking proper food, enduring harsh climates, learning unfamiliar languages, and braving treacherous terrains—forests, mountains, and deserts—they faced trials for the sake of Christ's love. They endured humiliation, never looking back, and many laid down their lives as martyrs.Last month, we explored the missionary journey

of Henry Martyn. This month, let us turn our attention to David Sundaranandam, a man of faith from Tamil Nadu.

David Sundaranandam was originally named Chinnamuthu. He was born in 1771 in a small village in the Sathankulam region of the Tirunelveli district. Tragedy struck early in his life when he lost both his parents to a sudden illness during his childhood. At the age of 17, circumstances forced him to leave his home. His aunt, unable to accept his ways, led him to depart from his village, Vijayaramapuram. With no destination in mind, he walked all the way to Sathankulam, from where he hitched a ride on a bullock cart bound for Rajapalayam. Eventually, he found himself in Thanjavur, where he took up a job at a small shop.

It was there that a life-changing encounter awaited him. One day, as he went about his routine, he was drawn to the powerful gospel message preached by the missionary Christian Friedrich Schwartz, who stood in the streets proclaiming the good news of Christ. His heart was captivated by the words of life, and he came to know about Jesus Christ. Overwhelmed by the truth, he

accepted Jesus as his personal Saviour and, in 1790, received water baptism, taking on the name David Sundaranandam. From that moment, his faith deepened, and he dedicated himself wholeheartedly to serving Christ as a devoted warrior of the gospel. Seeing his zeal and commitment, Schwartz personally mentored him, taking him along on every mission journey, shaping him into a bold and unwavering servant of God.

David Sundaranandam returned to his hometown and boldly proclaimed the gospel of Christ. As a result, 18 members of his own family in Vijayaramapuram embraced the faith and received baptism. Moved by their newfound devotion, they felt the need for a place to worship

the Lord. Thus, a simple church with a thatched roof made of palm leaves was built.

With an unshakeable zeal for the gospel, David Sundaranandam extended his ministry to the villages surrounding Sathankulam. Many were drawn to the message of Christ, leading to the baptism of 40 individuals from Shanmugapuram in October 1797. To facilitate their worship, another humble thatched-roof church was erected in their village. His evangelistic mission soon spread across the southeastern regions of Tirunelveli,

bringing many souls to Christ. Small churches began to emerge in these areas as well.

However, his growing ministry did not go unchallenged. Fierce opposition arose against him. Some of the newly built churches were set on fire, and Christians were excluded from their villages, humiliated, and stripped of their livelihoods. Life became uncertain, with neither safety nor stability for their families and possessions. Longing for peace and security, they sought a place where they could live and worship without fear.

With this vision, a piece of land was purchased, and a Christian settlement was established. A small prayer house was also built for communal worship. By 1799, around 28 Christian families left Vijayaramapuram and Shanmugapuram, constructing homes and settling in this new land. Since it was the first village entirely inhabited by Christians, David Sundaranandam named it Mudalur—the "First Village." It became a sanctuary for believers, a refuge amidst persecution. By the year 1800, Mudalur had grown into a thriving



Christian village with a community of 200 believers, standing as a testament to faith, resilience, and divine providence.

In the year 1801, a fierce battle took place in Panchalankurichi, during which Christians were brutally attacked, their homes set on fire, and many lost their lives. Among the structures reduced to ashes was the historic church in Mudalur. Yet, even in the face of such persecution, the light of the gospel could not be extinguished. Between April 1802 and June 1803, a remarkable spiritual awakening swept through the region, leading 5,382 people from 70 villages to receive the baptism of enlightenment through Guru Karpagam Sathiyanathan.

During this time, there was an extraordinary spir-

itual revival among the people, with David Sundaranandam playing a significant role in the movement. Despite intense opposition, the Church flourished and grew exponentially. The greater the oppression, the more the Christian faith spread.

However, the relentless adversaries of the gospel did not stop there. On May 22, 1803, they break into Christian refuge villages, setting fire to churches in Mudalur and other Christian settlements. Homes were burnt to the ground, villages were plundered, and believers faced se-

vere hardships. Yet, in the midst of suffering, they refused to waver. Their faith remained unshaken, and their resolve unwavering. In this hour of trial, David Sundaranandam stood as a pillar of strength, encouraging and fortifying them in their faith.

Upon witnessing this, the adversaries conspired to assassinate David Sundarananda. As he travelled to Bethlehem to attend a festival, deceitful schemers orchestrated a treacherous plot against him. Unbeknownst to him, poison had been laced into his meal. Consuming the fatal food, David Sundarananda met an untimely death in the year 1806, at the age of 36, in the village of Bethlehem. He thus became the first martyr of Tirunelveli.

Dear young people, as you read this, rememberyou are the missionary of your district in this generation! Prepare yourself to carry the Gospel in the revival that is yet to come. Your commitment and surrender will bring multitudes to Christ. Let the work of the king spread far and wide!



The Fig Tree Revived

Greetings to all dear friends in the name of Jesus! It is a great joy to connect with you through this historical article titled "The Fig Tree revived." This month, we embark on a journey to explore the origins of the fig tree—symbolic of the nation of Israel. How did Israel come into existence in the first place?

God chose a man from a family that worshipped idols. He spoke to him and commanded him to leave everything behind and set out on a journey to an unknown land that He would reveal. In obedience to this divine call, that man—Abraham set out, not alone, but with his wife by his side.

The Lord said to Abraham:

"Leave your country, your people, and your father's household, and go to the land I will show you" (Genesis 12:1). So Abram took his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, all their pos-



sessions, and the people they had acquired in Haran, and set out for Canaan. And thus, they arrived in the land of Canaan. (Genesis 12:5) This promised land—the land of Canaan—was the destination of their divine journey.

Abram, who obeyed this divine command, was later called **Abraham** by God. Similarly, his wife Sarai was renamed **Sarah** by the Lord. The Lord appeared to Abram and declared, "To your descendants, I will give this land." In response, Abram built an altar there to the Lord who had appeared to him (Genesis 12:7).

The Lord, who had promised, "I will surely bless you and make you exceedingly fruitful," indeed fulfilled His word. He abundantly blessed Abraham in every way and, in his old age, granted him a son, **Isaac**.

After Sarah's passing, Abraham arranged for Isaac to marry **Rebekah**. Following Abraham's time, the Lord continued to bless Isaac, the righteous heir of faith. To him and Rebekah, God granted twin sons—**Esau and Jacob**. Among them, the Lord chose Jacob.

Esau lived a life indifferent to God, while Jacob walked in the fear of the Lord. This difference was evident to their mother, Rebekah, who favoured Jacob. Her desire was for him to receive

the blessing, and she guided him in securing it from his father. This incident fuelled enmity between Jacob and Esau. Burning with rage, Esau declared, "I will not rest until I have killed my deceiving brother, Jacob." Fearing for his life, Jacob fled his homeland and sought refuge in Syria, in the house of his maternal uncle, Laban.

There, the Lord blessed Jacob abundantly, and his household flourished. He had four wives and twelve children—eleven of whom were sons. Years passed, and Jacob decided to leave his uncle's house and return to his homeland. However, fear gripped his heart—would Esau still seek to kill him? As he approached his homeland, he spent an entire night wrestling in prayer, crying out, "I will not let You go unless You bless me!"

At that moment, the Lord said, "Your name shall no longer be Jacob, but Israel, for you have struggled with God and with men, and have prevailed" (Genesis 32:28).

The Lord softened Esau's heart, and instead of vengeance, he extended grace toward his brother. Israel then settled in Canaan, where his father Isaac had lived. Among his children, **Joseph** was Israel's most beloved son. However, his brothers, consumed by jealousy, turned against him. They tormented him, betrayed him, and eventually sold him to traders who took him to Egypt as a slave.

To cover their sin, Joseph's brothers deceived their father, Israel, leading him to believe that his beloved son had perished. But God's hand was upon Joseph—even in slavery, He lifted him up. In a divine turn of events, the Lord exalted Joseph, making him the ruler of Egypt.

A great famine spread across the land, leaving people desperate for food. It was during this time that news reached Israel that grain was available in Egypt. Seizing the opportunity, he sent his sons to procure food. But little did they know that the

> very brother they had once betrayed and sought to destroy now stood before them as Egypt's governor.

> Joseph recognised his brothers instantly—the very ones who had tormented him, plotted against him, and sold him into slavery. Yet instead of harboring resentment, he chose forgiveness. He embraced them with grace, paving the way for reconcili-

ation. As a result, Israel (Jacob) and his entire household migrated to Egypt. At that time, Jacob's family numbered seventy (Genesis 46:27).

In Egypt, the descendants of Israel flourished. They multiplied abundantly, growing strong and numerous until they filled the land (Exodus 1:7).

Blessing Israel is the Lord's delight (Numbers 24:1). If it brings joy to God to bless Israel, then we, too, are blessed—for by faith, we are counted among the children of Israel!

34% of Users Lose Money to Fraudsters through Payment Apps



A recent study has revealed that one in three people in India lose money to fraudsters through digital payment applications.

EFICO, a private research firm, conducted a study last year on online fraud. The survey covered approximately 1,000 young people in India and 11,000 individuals across 14 countries.

Speaking on the findings, EFICO's

Managing Director made the following statement:

"Fraud through digital payment apps is on the rise in India. About 34% of users have fallen victim to scams while making payments for goods, services, or investments. Additionally, 60% of fraud cases occur due to deceptive messages sent by scammers."

The report also highlighted a worrying trend—high-value fraud cases (exceeding ₹ 8 lakh) doubled from 2% in 2023 to 4% in 2024. Meanwhile, 56% of Indian consumers reported falling prey to scams involving amounts below ₹ 50,000.

Despite these rising threats, 45% of customers recognized the fraud prevention measures implemented by banks. However, as digital transactions continue to grow, so do fraudulent activities, posing an ongoing challenge to India's financial landscape.
