



Hello, youngies...! Greetings in Jesus' name. Shall we hear from DR. JIHANS about her journey through medical school; the challenges she endured and the path that led her to become the first doctor in her family from southern Tamil Nadu?

Can you tell us about your family, childhood, and schooling?

My name is Jihans. My father is an engineer, and my mother is a homemaker. I have a younger brother who is currently pursuing engineering. From a very young age, my dream was clear—I wanted to become a doctor. There was never a second option in my mind. Engineering was not even a consideration. Becoming a doctor was my sole ambition.

Even as a child, when I was in first grade, I wrote down in my Bible, in the simplest English I knew, "I want to become a doctor" and prayed over it. This desire was deeply rooted in me from an early age. However, no one in my family was in the medical field, so I had no guidance or understanding of what the journey would entail. I was stepping into an unknown world as the first-generation doctor in my family.

During my childhood, my father raised us with great love and care. As a result, I never experienced any major hardships growing up. However, behind that shielded upbringing, my father went through immense struggles to provide for us. Though I was unaware of his hardships at the time, his sacrifices laid the foundation for my journey.

Alright... Your parents struggled to send you to college. How was your college life?

When I was in 11th grade, NEET had just been introduced. Today, everyone knows what NEET is, but back then, it was only in its second year, and we had no clue how to prepare for it. There was no proper guidance, and we were told that our state board marks wouldn't matter anymore. So, I focused entirely on NEET preparation.

From Monday to Friday, I studied my school syllabus. On Saturdays and Sundays, I attended NEET coaching and dedicated my time solely to preparing for the exam. I was just an average student, and cracking NEET felt like an enormous challenge.

When the results were out and counselling began, I realized how tough it was even to secure the basic qualifying marks. But by God's grace and relentless hard work, I cleared the exam. Getting into medical college, however, was another hurdle—one that required a huge financial commitment. My family went through immense struggles to pay my fees, and it was nothing short of a miracle that God Himself stepped in to meet our needs. He not only provided for my education but also gave me the strength to pursue it.

Could you share your college experiences?

Until my 12th grade, I had never stepped out of my home or been away from my parents. For the first time in my life, I left behind the warmth of my home and ventured out alone. That was my very first experience of independence.

My first year of college was nothing short of a challenge. I faced numerous struggles, to the point where I even contemplated quitting. Everything felt new and unfamiliar. There was so much to study, yet I had no idea how to approach it. It was an overwhelming phase.

How did God bless your academic journey? Tell us about your exam days.

During exams, sleep and rest became luxuries. Like every other student, I too had to push myself beyond limits. The anxiety was intense—I would feel too restless to eat, and practical exams were especially nerve-wracking. Fear gripped me so much that it sometimes felt like my mind would go blank despite all my preparation. Sleep would beckon, but the very thought of exams kept me awake. On most days, I barely slept for three hours. Even if I set my alarm for 4 AM, I would wake up much earlier, unable to rest.

In those restless nights, I found immense comfort in Psalm 34. I would read it with tears, but by the time I finished, peace would flood my heart, giving me the strength to move forward. Then, I would begin my studies with renewed courage. Whenever I struggled, my friends stood by me like a pillar of support. Their encouragement helped me navigate through every hardship. That's how my college life unfolded—a journey of trials, resilience, and divine grace.

Amidst all this, we had a small Christian fellowship of about 15 to 20 girls. Every Sunday morning, without fail, we gathered for an hour to read the Bible and pray together. That fellowship became our strength, our spiritual anchor. Despite



our hectic schedules, we never let go of this fellowship. It was through these moments of faith and unity that we found the strength to endure and thrive.

Tell us about the final moments of your medical journey...

The moment I received my final results was one of the most joyful experiences of my life. While writing my exams, I found one subject particularly challenging, and it filled me with fear. I earnestly prayed, "Lord, I don't want to return to this college to study again." By God's boundless grace, I passed every subject successfully. That moment is forever etched in my memory. As I stood there, overwhelmed with joy, the struggles of the past five and a half years flashed before my eyes in a single instant. I realized that every hardship, every sleepless night, and every sacrifice had led to this one defining moment. The fulfilment of my childhood dream brought me immense happiness.

A Word to Aspiring Doctors

To all those determined to study medicine—if I, an average student with many weaknesses, could succeed, so can you! Study with diligence, persevere through challenges, and most importantly, seek God's presence and pray. The same Jesus who granted me wisdom will surely grant it to you as well. Whether you are preparing for

NEET or already in medical school, give your full attention to your studies without distraction. Pray earnestly, and God will guide you. When you study with prayer, the Lord Himself will lead you to focus on the right topics and prepare you for what's to come in your exams.

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Dear Young People, Dr. Jihans' journey was not an effortless one. Through moments of weakness and hardship, God walked beside her, strengthened her, and led her through the toughest of paths. If years of sacrifice, sleepless nights, and separation from family could transform her into a doctor today, then know this—God is more than able to do the same in your life! 

"But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Galatians 6:14).

Paul, once a fierce opponent of Jesus and a relentless persecutor of Christians, imprisoned and tortured those who proclaimed Christ. He was deeply devoted to Jewish traditions and zealously defended them. However, in Acts 9, the risen Christ personally appeared to him, transforming his life forever. Paul came to the undeniable realisation that Jesus Christ was the true God, accepting Him as his personal saviour. From that moment, his life took a radical turn.

Having experienced an intimate walk with Christ, Paul went on to establish numerous churches. Through him, God revealed how the Church should function and how believers should grow in Him. His epistles, inspired by the Holy Spirit, became foundational teachings for the Church. A closer reading of Paul's writings reveals that, whether explicitly or implicitly, he constantly pointed to the cross of Christ. For him, the cross was not just a historical event but the very essence of his life and message. It was at the cross that the weight of sin was fully revealed, and through it, the boundless grace of God was made known.

Was now hanging between heaven and earth between two criminals—on a cross, like a condemned thief.

Scripture reveals that this very God, who fashioned the universe, became man and was lifted up on the cross in the name of Jesus (Psalm 33:16).

But why would the Creator of the heavens and the earth endure such a fate? What crime had He committed?

In those days, the Roman government reserved the brutal punishment of crucifixion for the most heinous criminals—rebels against the state, murderers, looters, and those who posed a grave threat to society.

What sin had Jesus committed? What offence had He done to deserve such a death?

Even Judas Iscariot, who had spent three and a half years by His side and ultimately betrayed Him, knew Jesus well. If anyone could have accused Him, it would have been Judas. Yet, as we examine the life of Christ, we find no fault, no crime, no sin—only the unfathomable love that led Him to the cross.

The Scriptures paint a striking picture of the innocence of Jesus. When Judas, overwhelmed with guilt, cried out, "I have betrayed innocent blood!" (Matthew 27:4), he was acknowledging a truth that even Jesus' fiercest opponents could not deny—there was no fault in Him. Though sentenced to death, when brought before the Roman governor Pilate, he too declared, "I find no basis for a charge against Him." (John 19:4).

Witnessing the unfolding events, even the hardened Roman centurion and his battle-hardened soldiers testified, "Truly, this was the Son of God!" They recognised what others refused to see—lesus was no ordinary man. He was blameless, without sin, and set apart. His accusers, driven by envy and malice, could not point to a single wrongdoing in His life.

And yet, this sinless One bore the punishment for the sins of the world. "He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities." (Isaiah 53:5). The cross stands as a chilling revelation of sin's horror—it was not the nails that held Him there, but our iniquities. The weight of our rebellion was what led Him to Calvary. The cross exposes the true gravity of sin, but more so, it unveils the immeasurable love of Christ.

Today, you too may be living in sin—perhaps entangled in alcohol addiction, substance abuse, lustful desires, fleshly cravings, pride, indifference, gossip, or hidden sins lurking in the depths of your private life. You may have dismissed these as trivial, but do you realise the gravity of sin? It was sin that led the Son of God to the cross. It was sin that nailed the Holy One upon that cruel cross. Because of our transgressions, He surrendered Himself to death on the cross (Galatians 1:4). It was our sin that drove Him to Calvary. Sin is not a small matter—it is so dreadful that it crucified the Holy One of God.

Dear young people, Though you know Jesus, though you have been to church, though you understand that He died for you—how much longer will you continue

in sin, nailing Him to the cross? How many more days will you grieve His heart with your waywardness? Even now, the Lord is calling out to you—to turn away from sin, to set your life apart in holiness, and to surrender yourself completely to Him. Look upon the Saviour hanging on the cross! Turn back to Him today—run to Jesus without delay!



Across the world, the symbol of the cross is seen in churches, homes, and cathedral spires. Many Christians wear it around their necks as a token of faith, while others mark their foreheads with it during Lent. For most, the cross has become nothing more than a symbol—an emblem of identity.

Yet, Jesus' call to those who would follow Him was far more profound: "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, take up his cross daily, and follow Me." (Luke 9:23)

For many, the mention of the cross evokes thoughts of suffering, trials, insults, and humiliation. And while these are indeed part of the Christian journey, they are not its entirety. The cross we are called to bear must be understood in the light of Christ Himself.

Jesus did not merely endure pain on the cross—He revealed love, forgiveness, mercy, and redemption through it. Even as He hung in agony, ridiculed and scorned, He looked upon His tormentors with compassion and uttered:

"Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34)


This is the lesson of the cross that Jesus teaches us. It is not just about enduring suffering but about responding to rejection, humiliation, and injustice with love and forgiveness. The cross teaches us not merely to bear hardships but to extend grace to those who wrong us. To carry our cross is to walk the path of Christ—not just in pain, but in love that transcends pain.

If you truly want to forgive others, you must learn to endure all things just as Jesus did. "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me" (Galatians 2:20). The more you surrender yourself to be

crucified with Christ each day, the more you will truly live in Him. This means that your old self—your flesh, its desires, worldly passions, grudges, bitterness, anger, conflicts, and divisions—must be surrendered to the cross daily with the help of the Holy Spirit. "Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires" (Galatians 5:24). When you willingly take up your cross each day and fix your eyes on the crucified Christ, your life will be transformed, enabling you to love and bear with others just as He did.

You cannot truly belong to Christ if you refuse to love those around you, lack compassion, and hold on to unforgiveness. Jesus Himself said, "Whoever does not take up their cross and follow me is not worthy of me" (Matthew 10:38). To follow Christ means to walk in His





footsteps. Yet today, many wear the symbol of the cross but live no differently from the world. If you do the same, how can you be worthy of Him? Instead, do for others what Christ has done for you. Only then will you be truly His.

Dear young people, "The message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God" (I Corinthians 1:18). Make the cross the centre of your life every day, and you will receive renewed strength. Singing "The cross before me, the world behind me" is not enough you must truly live it. Take up your cross daily and walk as Jesus walked!

Last month, we explored the origins of the Israelites. This month, let us journey through the historical formation of the land of Israel.

While in Egypt, the Israelites multiplied greatly under God's blessing. However, a new Pharaoh, who did not know Joseph, rose to power and subjected them to severe oppression. In response to their suffering, God chose a deliverer from among them—Moses—to set His people free.

In those days, the Lord made a covenant with Abraham, declaring:

"To your descendants, I give this land from the river of Egypt to the great river, the Euphrates—land inhabited by the Kenites, Kenizzites, Kadmonites, Hittites, Perizzites, Rephaites, Amorites, Canaanites, Girgashites, and Jebusites." (Genesis 15:18-20) When the cries of His people reached Him, the Lord spoke to Moses, saying:

"I have indeed seen the misery of My people in Egypt. I have heard their cries because of their oppressors, and I am aware of their suffering. I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up into a good and spacious land—a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites, and Jebusites." (Exodus 3:7-8) Thus began the divine mission to lead Israel into the Promised Land, fulfilling God's covenant and His eternal plan.

The Israelites were delivered from Egypt by the mighty hand of the Lord, who chose Moses as His instrument. The scripture states, "With a mighty hand, the Lord brought us out of Egypt, out of the house of bondage" (Exodus 13:14).

After the servant of the Lord, Moses, passed away, God spoke to Joshua, the son of Nun, Moses' assistant, saying:

"Moses, My servant, is dead. Now, therefore, arise, you and all these people, and cross over the Jordan into the land I am giving to the children of Israel. Every place the sole of your foot treads upon, I have given to you, just as I promised Moses. Your territory will extend from the wilderness and Lebanon to the great river, the Euphrates—all the land of the Hittites—to the Great Sea where the sun sets." (Joshua 1:1-4)

This was the promised land of Canaan, as spoken by the Lord. After Moses, God led the Israelites into Canaan through Joshua, and thus, the land of Israel was established. Joshua oversaw the division of the land among the twelve tribes of Israel.

Following Joshua's time,



Israel was ruled by judges until the Lord raised up the prophet Samuel. Later, the people chose Saul as their king.

But when Saul was rejected, God appointed David—a man after His own heart—to reign. David conquered Jerusalem and made it the capital of Israel, solidifying the identity of the nation. "He reigned over Judah in Hebron for seven years and six months, and in Jerusalem, he reigned over all Israel and Judah for thirty-three years." (2 Samuel 5:5)

If God could take a single man—Abraham bless him, and transform him into a great nation called Israel, how much more will He bless and multiply you! If you remain steadfast as His chosen people, the Lord will surely prosper you.

"Look to Abraham your father and to Sarah who bore you; when he was but one, I called him, blessed him, and made him many." (Isaiah 51:2) Until we meet again next month, may the grace of God abide with you all!

If God provides us with bread and meat, we won't receive it unless we open the windows for the raven to come in! Please open them." The mother was astonished by the child's faith. Without hesitation, she opened the window.

Unbeknownst to them, outside their house, taking shelter from the rain, stood the mayor of the city. He had overheard their conversation. Deeply moved, he hurried away, bought an abundance of food, and discreetly placed the parcels through the open window before leaving. Hearing a soft thud, the children rushed to the window and found food parcels lying there. Overjoyed, they lifted their hands in gratitude, thanking God for His provision.

THE MOST HOLY PLACE

In past months, we explored the Holy Place within the Tabernacle and its three sacred elements. This month, let's step deeper into the divine mystery of the Most Holy Place, uncovering its significance, sacred contents, and profound truths.

THE DIMENSIONS OF THE MOST HOLY PLACE

The Most Holy Place was a perfect square, measuring 15 cubits in length, width, and height—symbolizing divine perfection (Revelation 21:16). Just as the New Jerusalem is described as a flawless square, the earthly sanctuary mirrored this heavenly design.

THE VEIL OF SEPARATION (EXODUS 26:31-33)

A magnificent veil, woven with blue, purple, and scarlet yarn and fine-twined linen, adorned with cherubim, separated the Holy Place from the Most Holy Place. Suspended on four acacia wood pillars overlaid with gold, it was more than a curtain it was a sacred boundary, allowing only the High Priest to enter once a year.

Without holiness and proper adherence to divine ordinances, stepping inside could mean instant death. The veil symbolized God's unapproachable holiness. However, when Jesus breathed His last, the temple veil was torn from top to bottom (Matthew 27:51; Luke 23:45), signifying that Christ had opened the way for us to enter God's presence through His ultimate sacrifice. The veil was torn because Jesus shed His precious blood, paying the ultimate price for sin. Just as man fell through selfwill, Christ bore sin upon Himself, having His flesh torn on the cross (Hebrews 10:19).

WHAT WAS INSIDE THE MOST HOLY PLACE? THE ARK OF THE COVENANT (EXODUS 25:10-15)

Crafted from acacia wood and overlaid with pure gold, the Ark measured 2.5 cubits in length, 1.5 cu-

bits in width, and height. Golden rings were fixed to its sides, allowing it to be carried with inserted poles. Inside were three sacred items: the golden jar of manna, Aaron's budding staff, and the tablets of the covenant.

THE MERCY SEAT

A solid gold cover was placed over the Ark (Exodus 40:20), and the Mercy Seat was where God declared, "I will appear in a cloud above the Mercy Seat" (Leviticus 16:2). Two cherubim stood on either side, and from between them, God made His presence known.

How could a holy God dwell among sinful men? The answer lay in the atonement sacrifice. Blood sprinkled upon the Mercy Seat allowed God to dwell among His people (Leviticus 16:14-15). This blood enabled God to remain just while justifying those who approached Him in faith (Romans 3:26).

THE CHERUBIM (EXODUS 25:18-20)

Two cherubim, hammered out of pure gold, stood at either end of the Mercy Seat, wings touching while facing each other. Only the High Priest could behold them. Their presence symbolized divine protection, recalling how God stationed cherubim to guard the Tree of Life (Genesis 3:24). Both the veil and the cherubim reminded humanity of its sinful state.

WHY THE MOST HOLY PLACE?

God declared, "There, above the Mercy Seat, between the cherubim, I will meet with you and give my commands for the Israelites" (Exodus 25:22). The Most Holy Place was where divine presence met humanity, where God's voice was heard, and His instructions were revealed.

Now you have glimpsed the significance of the Most Holy Place—its purpose, entry requirements, and sacred contents. But there's more! Next month, we'll explore fascinating details of the Tabernacle. Stay tuned!

Missionary Biography: William

David Brainerd was born on April 20, 1718, in Haddam, Connecticut, USA. He was the sixth of nine children in his family. Tragedy struck early in his life—he lost his father at the age of nine and his mother when he was just fourteen. These losses left him burdened with sorrow and consumed by a deep fear of death from a young age. As a result, he grew up without the joys of childhood, devoid of playfulness and happiness. Seeking solace, he turned to worldly pleasures, only to be plagued by guilt and inner turmoil.



One Sunday morning, a profound thought gripped his heart—the terrifying wrath of God. Stricken with conviction, he fasted and prayed the entire day, wrestling with the weight of his sins. As he poured out his heart in repentance, God's mercy embraced him, filling him with an unshakeable peace.

At the age of 21, he enrolled at Yale College to pursue his studies. However, due to illness, he was forced to discontinue his education. In 1742, a powerful sermon by Ebenezer Pemberton ignited a fire within him—a call to take the Gospel to the Native Americans. As he listened, Brainerd's heart burnt with a divine burden. He resolved to leave behind all worldly comforts, embracing hardship—even death if necessary to build God's kingdom among the unreached. Confirming his calling, he learnt about a missionary organisation in Scotland that was sending missionaries to the Native Americans. Without hesitation, he joined their mission, ready to carry the light of Christ into the wilderness, no matter the cost.

He stayed in Kaunameek, New York, dedicating himself to learning languages. Under the guidance of John Sergeant, he gained profound insights into ministry and its many facets. It was in Kaunameek, among the Native Americans, that he began his mission work.

His days started before dawn, immersed in prayer and meditation, preparing his heart before preaching the Gospel to the indigenous people. His ministry journey was filled with immense hardships. At night, he would rest on a makeshift bed—wooden planks stacked with a layer of straw. Undeterred by rugged terrains and harsh conditions, he tirelessly walked long distances to share the message of Christ. Hardships were his constant companions. Even something as basic as bread required a 15-mile walk, prompting him to adopt the diet of the Native Americans.

He moved hearts to tears wherever he preached. People listened, deeply convicted, and embraced Christ with sincerity. Even children were touched by his message. Some white settlers, curious and sceptical, initially approached him thinking he was a madman. Yet, upon hearing him, they too were transformed. In a single week, twenty-five people boldly stood up to testify for the Lord, their lives forever changed.

In the year 1745, a great spiritual awakening took place in a place called Crosswicks. Within just a year and a half, 150 people had grown in faith. Wherever he went, he established churches and guided people toward the truth. The British authorities, fearing that he was stirring up trouble among the natives and acting against their rule, sought ways to punish him. Yet, no scheme or opposition could hinder his mission.

In September 1746, he fell severely ill with a relentless cough and fever, experiencing excruciating pain in his body. Even in that weakened state, he walked to minister among the natives. Though he reached a point where he could neither rise, walk, read, nor write, his spirit remained steadfast, full of zeal and joy. When doctors declared that his tuberculosis had reached its final stage and survival was impossible, he remained undisturbed, radiating an unshakeable joy and enthusiasm.

After five years of tireless missionary work—of which 19 weeks were spent bedridden—he entered eternity on October 9, 1749, at the young age of 29.

Dear young people, let not sickness, hardship, or persecution shake your commitment to the divine call! This young man, burdened with a passion for the souls of the indigenous people, laid down his life as a seed of revival in an unfamiliar land, forsaking all comforts. What about you? Do you carry a burden for the people of our land? Will you rise with unwavering passion, understand the heartbeat of God, and dedicate yourself to His great mission?

My dear young ones, Greetings to you in the precious name of our Lord Jesus! Last month, under the theme "I Am a Prayer Warrior," we reflected on the blessing that Zechariah received through his persistent prayer.

THE PRAYER OF TEARS!

In the mountainous region of Ephraim lay a serene village called Ramathaim, home to a man named Elkanah. His very name means "God's Authority." Elkanah had two wives—Hannah and Peninnah. While Peninnah was blessed with ten children,

> Hannah had none (I Samuel I:2, 8).

Who wept? Why did she weep? Under what circumstances did she weep? Was her prayer answered?

Every year, Elkanah took his two wives and children to Shiloh, a place nestled in the hill country of Ephraim, to offer sacrifices to the Lord.

The name Shiloh itself means "a place of rest," a sanctuary where one could pause, worship, and seek God's presence. Yet, even in this sacred journey meant for devotion, Hannah found no peace. Peninnah, Elkanah's other wife, relentlessly taunted her, cruelly highlighting the one sorrow that weighed heaviest on Hannah's heart—her barrenness (I Samuel I:6). Her words were like arrows, piercing Hannah's soul, leaving her in anguish. Overwhelmed by grief, she lost her appetite and wept bitterly, unable to contain the sorrow that consumed her.

Elkanah did not despise his wife; on the contrary, he loved her deeply and gave her a double portion. Yet, despite his tender words—"Why are you weeping? Why don't you eat? Why is your heart troubled?" her soul found no comfort. She had come to Shiloh countless times before, but this time was different. With unshakeable resolve, she determined that she would not return home without receiving a miracle from the Lord.

In the presence of the Almighty, she poured out the burdens of her heart, weeping bitterly as she prayed—"O Lord of Hosts (Jehovah Sabaoth), if You would grant me a son..." She lingered in prayer for a long time, lost in the depths of her supplication.

From a distance, Eli, the high priest, observed her. Misjudging the silent movement of her lips and the anguish on her face, he assumed she was intoxicated—recklessly babbling in the house of God. Without understanding her pain, he rebuked her, saying, "How long are you going to stay drunk? Put away your wine" (1 Samuel 1:14).

Alone in her grief, she must have wept, thinking, "Is there no one who truly understands me?"

But the Lord of Hosts does not see as man sees. He looked beyond outward appearances and beheld Hannah's sorrow and longing. He heard the prayer woven with her tears at His feet and granted her a son—Samuel. Even to this day, Samuel, the child born of tearful supplication, is spoken of, preached about, and remembered.

In response to Hannah's fervent prayer, God raised Samuel in the 17th generation to fulfil multiple divine roles:

- I. A Levite,
- 2. A Priest,
- 3. A High Priest,
- 4. A Chief High Priest,
- 5. A Prophet,
- 6. The Leader of Prophets,
- 7. A Judge,
- 8. The one who anointed kings.

Hello, dear brothers and sisters!

As the Scripture says, "Ask for the ancient paths and walk in them," we have been reflecting on how Christianity was in the past and how it has become modernised today.

Then

One of the topics of debate in this period is the practice of wearing a head covering (Scarf). There was a time when stepping into a church meant seeing every woman with a head covering, a sign of reverence passed down from one generation to another. Little children, having seen their mothers and sisters veiled, naturally followed suit.

But today, when we enter a church, we see a mix—some wearing a head covering, while others display intricate hairstyles of various styles and fashions.

It is undeniable that God sees both men and women as equal. However, some argue that wearing a head covering in church disrupts this gender equality. On the other hand, some view it as an expression of deep reverence and insist that those who do not cover their heads should not even be allowed inside the church. Up until the early 1960s, even in Western churches, women commonly covered their heads with hats or scarves as a mark of modesty. Yet, today, I Corinthians I 1:4-5 is often cited in debates about whether this practice is outdated or inconsistent with modern gender equality.

Now

Personally, I find guidance in Matthew 18:7-9, which reminds us that our appearance—whether it be our hair or accessories—should never become a stumbling block to others.

Every nation has its own customs. In England, when people meet the Queen, they show their reverence with a slight bow. In Arab nations, there is a specific way to greet a royal prince as a gesture of honour. Likewise, Jesus Christ is the King of kings, the Lord of heaven. Shouldn't we, then, express our reverence for Him?

Rather than debating whether wearing a head covering is right or wrong, let our focus be on glorifying the One who redeemed us. Let our worship be clothed in holiness. "Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness" (Psalm 96:9) ■

Poverty in India

With a poverty rate of 51.9%, Bihar stands as the poorest state in India, struggling with severe economic hardships. Following closely behind are Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, and Madhya Pradesh, ranking as the second, third, and fourth poorest states, respectively. Meghalaya holds the next position in this ranking. Despite these challenges, Goa has witnessed a rapid decline in poverty levels, along with Jammu & Kashmir, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, and Rajasthan, where poverty is steadily decreasing. Among all Indian states, Kerala has the lowest poverty rate, with only 0.71% of its population living below the poverty line. Other states with significantly low poverty rates include Goa (3.76%), Sikkim (3.82%), Tamil Nadu (4.89%), and Punjab (5.59%).

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Jer Guide Teenage Pregnancy

According to the National Family Health Survey, one in four women in India is married before the age of 18, and 7.8% of girls aged 15 to 19 are either pregnant or already mothers. In Tamil Nadu, while the number of married women conceiving has significantly declined over the past five years, teenage pregnancies have risen alarmingly. Reports from the Public Health Department reveal that the number of teenage pregnancies, which stood at 11,772 in 2019-20, surged to 14,360 in 2023-24—an increase of 20%. Furthermore, last year, 1.5% of all pregnancies were among teenage girls.

India's agriculture and allied industries employ a staggering 640 million people, with 80% of them directly dependent on farming. However, over the past few years, 220,000 farmers have tragically taken their lives due to debt burdens, poverty, and other distressing circumstances. Adding to the crisis, 74 million tonnes of food go to waste every year, raising serious concerns about food security and the looming threat of famine.

Job Opportunities on the Rise, but Salaries Stagnant: NITI Aayog Member Expresses Concern



Over the past seven years, the employment rate has been steadily increasing, surpassing population growth. Despite fluctuations, the overall trend indicates a rise in job opportunities. In 2017-18, the labour force participation rate stood at 34.7%, which has now climbed to 43.7% in the 2023-24 financial year.

However, while wages have seen an upward trajectory over these years, they have not kept pace with inflation. The primary reason for this, according to experts, is the lack of adequate skill levels among workers. Comparative data from various countries highlight that India's workforce lags in skill development.

In response, the central government has been implementing measures to enhance workforce capabilities. State governments must also take proactive steps in this regard. Only when skill levels improve will productivity rise, leading to better wages and overall economic growth, the NITI Aayog member emphasised.

Over ₹400 Crore Spent by Central Government on Legal Cases in the Past Decade



The Central Government has spent over ₹400 crore on legal proceedings in the past ten years. According to official statistics released by the government, a sum of ₹66 crore was expended on court cases in the financial year 2023-24 alone—an increase of ₹9 crore compared to the previous year (2022-23).

In the last decade, the government's cumulative expenditure on legal cases has exceeded ₹409 crore. Breaking down the figures, ₹26.64 crore was spent in 2014-15, while the following year (2015-16) saw an expenditure of ₹37.43 crore.

A Backlog of 7 Lakh Cases: Across various courts in the country, approximately 7 lakh cases involving the Central Government remain pending. Notably, around 2 lakh of these cases are linked to the Ministry of Finance. These figures highlight the significant legal burden borne by the government, as outlined in the official report.
