The Rebel GOD REDEEMED..!

We had the joy of meeting Pastor Gokul Joseph at his church in Palladam, where he shared some powerful and inspiring moments from his life. We've compiled his testimony for your blessing and encouragement.



Testimony: Godwin

Can you tell us about your childhood and family background?

We are originally from Madurai. I was born into a priestly family and raised with deep religious zeal. We built our own temple and regularly performed rituals and worship. My grandfather would do intense acts of devotion like dancing with spears and walking on sharp blades. Our family was passionate about our faith, and our home had a dedicated prayer room with over 200 images of various deities. Such was the spiritual fervour of the household I was born into. During my early years, we relocated from Madurai to Palladam.

Why did you move from your hometown to Palladam?

When I was very young, my father got a temporary job at the EB (Electricity Board) in

Kangeyam, Tiruppur District, with a meagre salary of ₹30 per month. We settled in Palladam, and my father would commute over an hour daily to work. We lived in a row house, cramped with eight of us in a single space, with just one toilet shared among 30 houses. Later, we moved to another row house shared among 12 families — it had a toilet, but no door.

Despite having a decent income and good food at home, peace was absent. My father would return drunk and throw away the food my mother lovingly prepared. He drank every day and smoked two packs of cigarettes. Ours was a house full of chaos.

Even with all the money, your home lacked peace. Did you seek any solutions?

Yes. We began visiting many temples, but the constant quarrels between my parents didn't



stop. My mother, sister, and I would often hide on the rooftop in fear of my father. In the middle of this tension, a woman known to my mother suggested we seek prayer from a Christian pastor she knew. We disliked Christians — we considered them low caste and wouldn't even take water from them. We dismissed the idea angrily.

But as our problems worsened, my parents reluctantly allowed the pastor to visit. He came and prayed. That very moment, we began experiencing an inexplicable peace in our home. Gradually, both my mother and father accepted Jesus into their hearts.

That's unbelievable! Both your parents became followers of Jesus? How did that happen?

Shortly after, my father's job became permanent. His salary jumped from ₹30 to ₹2,500. That was a turning point. My father realized that despite seeking countless gods, nothing had changed — but when the Christians prayed, blessings followed. He began attending church nearby and grew deeply in faith. My mother, too, became passionate in her pursuit of Christ.

We disliked Christians; we considered them low caste and wouldn't even take water from them.

What made your mother so zealous for Jesus?

Since my father worked with the EB, he had to climb electric poles. One day, while on duty, he fell from a pole, was badly injured, and lay unconscious. The doctors at Palladam couldn't handle the case, so we rushed him to



Coimbatore. By the time we arrived, his body had gone cold and stiff.

Though my mother had started believing in Jesus, she feared that leaving our ancestral gods might have brought this misfortune. But clinging to her new faith, she removed all her jewels — her wedding chain, bangles — and prayed, “Lord, if You heal my husband, I will follow You wholeheartedly.”

As they were about to carry him from the van to the stretcher, something miraculous happened — my father stood up and began walking on his own. That moment deeply impacted my mother, and her faith in Christ solidified.

Such an incredible miracle! Your parents accepted Christ... but what about your own life?

While my parents went to church, I rebelled. I hung out with those who hated Jesus. I would actively visit temples and engage in idol worship. I had an intense hatred for Christianity and Christian values.

My friends were mostly rowdies, and even during my school days, I had a unique style — rings on all five fingers, heavy chains around my neck. My mother would often plead, “I believe in Jesus now, and you still continue in



idolatry!” I’d argue back, “Just because you removed your jewellery and changed your faith doesn’t mean I will. My gods are important to me!” Though I had no real faith, I had religious fervour. I saw Jesus as a “foreign god” and wanted nothing to do with Him.

Then how did your transformation take place?

One day, a group of us — about 20 — beat up 10 others. One of the victims fell, and as I kicked him, his tooth broke and injured my leg. Even today, the scar remains. My leg became swollen and infected. Meanwhile, the incident escalated into a communal clash, and 50 people planned to take revenge by beating me up. I was terrified. Amid all this tension, someone advised me to lay low for a while. I was lying at home, unsure what to do, when a TV advertisement flashed about a Bible College opening in Nalumavadi. Seeing it, my mother suggested, “Why don’t you go study there?” I didn’t know anything about the Bible, but needing a safe place, I agreed. Quietly at night, my mother took me to Nalumavadi.

You went to hide... what was your experience at Bible College?

I didn’t understand a word during classes — I’d often sleep through them. Sin still

dominated my life. I was just counting the days. I had no interest. A whole year passed, but there was no change in me. My classmates would invite me to the tabernacle of God, but I always refused. One day, I went just to see what it was about. I watched them pray while I sat casually.

But as I continued attending, I started liking the songs. I bought a diary and copied down 1,000 songs. Then one night, I clearly heard a voice within me say, “Go to the tabernacle of God.” I obeyed, carrying my Bible and diary, knelt down — and wept uncontrollably for two hours.

I confessed every sin — beating preachers, disturbing churches, mocking believers. After two hours of crying, I heard another voice: “You didn’t come here by accident. I brought you. Just as I was with Moses, I will be with you. What I’m going to do through you will be mighty.” I collapsed, as if lifeless, for about 10 minutes. That encounter changed everything.

Amazing! What followed after such a divine encounter?

As soon as the Lord said, “I have called you for ministry,” a deep peace and joy filled me. I began reading the Bible passionately. I couldn’t live the way I had before. I started preaching



in villages around Nalumavadi. God used me to lead some souls to Christ. The Holy Spirit began shaping me powerfully over the next two years. After completing three years, I thought of staying and serving in Nalumavadi, but the Lord said, “This is not your place. Go to your hometown — I have great plans for you there.” Immediately, I returned to Palladam.

So the place you hid became the place of your calling. How did your ministry begin in your hometown?

My mother and a few women had already been praying together at home. With her support, I started ministry work. The opposition was fierce. No one helped me. But as I continued in prayer, miracles began to happen. Souls started coming.

From 4 people, the fellowship grew to 100. None of them were from Christian families; all were saved from non-Christian backgrounds. I went village to village preaching the gospel, and by God’s grace, today we have a church functioning on the third floor of our own house. In the very place we were told not to have worship, we now gather joyfully! The same friends who once fought with me are now standing with me.

Tell us about your family life.

I got married three years ago. My wife, Jennifer Samantha, is a great

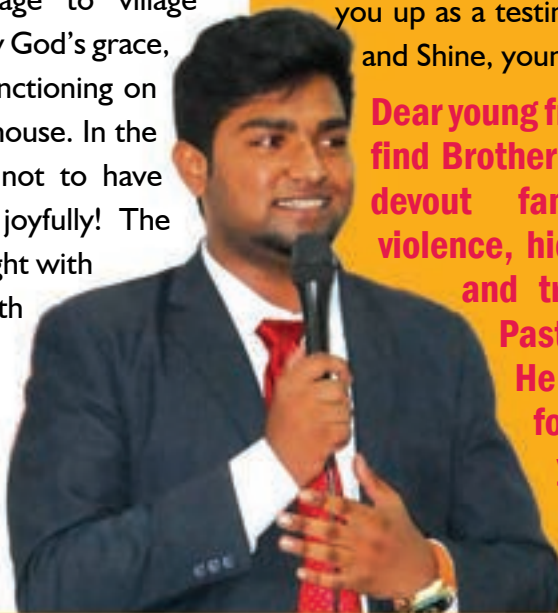


support in all aspects of life. For three years, we had no children. We faced mockery and harsh words. But by God’s grace, He has now blessed us with a child — and lifted our heads high in the same place we once bowed in shame.

What would you like to say to today’s youth?

To all the youth reading this: there may be thousands around you, but you are reading this because God has chosen you. This world is working hard to pull you down. But if you stand firm with zeal for the Lord, He will raise you up as a testimony in this land. Rise and Shine, young warrior!

Dear young friends, if God could find Brother Gokul — born in a devout family, caught in violence, hiding from enemies and transform him into Pastor Gokul Joseph, He can do the same for you. If you open your heart to Jesus, He can make you His child too!



Faith in the Word

During His time on earth, Jesus went about doing good—healing the sick, setting the captives free, performing miracles, and blessing people wherever He went. The Bible tells us that people suffering from various afflictions sought Him for healing and deliverance.

One such person was a father, desperate for his son who was tormented by an unclean spirit and writhing in agony. He came to Jesus and prayed, "If You can do anything, have compassion on us and help us." Jesus responded, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes" (Mark 9:23). It is our faith that draws miracles from the hand of God.

What should we believe in?

We must believe in the Word of God—His promises recorded in Scripture. In Matthew 8:8, a Roman centurion comes to Jesus and says, "My servant lies at home paralyzed, suffering terribly. Just say the word, and my servant will be healed." Jesus replied, "I will come and heal him." But the centurion responded, "Lord, I am not worthy to have You come under my roof.

But speak only a word, and my servant will be healed." He firmly believed in the authority of Jesus' word—and that faith moved the Lord.

How can we believe in the Word and receive miracles?

There was a brother once diagnosed with a severe illness and written off by doctors as beyond recovery. In that critical moment, he turned to prayer and began to meditate on the Word. One verse from Psalm 117:17–18 stood out to him: **"I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord. The Lord has chastened me severely, but He has not given me over to death."** He started reading it aloud, again and again, so his ears would hear it.

As he did, faith began to rise within him. Declaring it boldly and worshipping the Lord,



he eventually received healing—and today, he testifies for Jesus. Faith in God's Word leads to miracles.

But what if I don't have any faith? How can I gain it?

"So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God" (Romans 10:17). As you keep listening to and meditating on God's Word, your faith will grow. It is the living, powerful Word of God that births faith in us. When you read Scripture, faith is stirred. When you speak words that declare Jesus as a miracle-working God—the same yesterday, today, and forever—your faith will be strengthened.

Reading the Word and meditating on it with the help of the Holy Spirit builds faith. But speaking unbelief produces more unbelief. When Scripture is taught wrongly, Satan operates through it, breaking our faith and planting doubt in our hearts. But when we believe the Word and listen with expectation, the Holy Spirit moves and ignites faith within us. Miracles follow. Faith comes by hearing the Word of God—living and powerful words that work within us to revive both our faith and our lives.

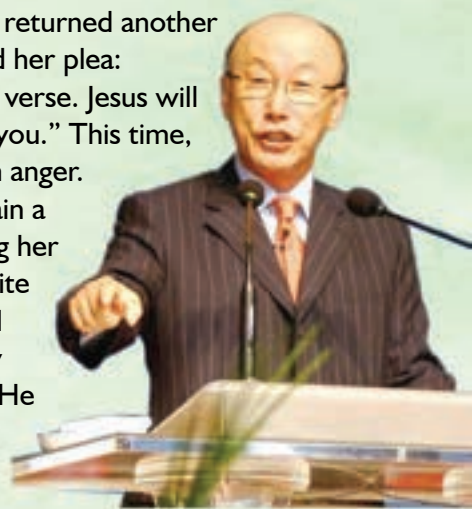
A true story from South Korea!

In South Korea, a 17-year-old boy who followed Buddhism was left on his deathbed after both his lungs failed. Doctors had given up hope. News of his critical condition spread everywhere. Meanwhile, a young Christian girl who had heard of his situation felt a deep burden in her heart. She prayed fervently and then took him a copy of the New Testament, saying, "Please read this verse. Jesus will heal you." But the boy, filled with rage, threw the Bible aside and said, "I already have a religion. You've come here to preach about a new god named Jesus?" He insulted the girl and sent her away.

Undeterred, she returned another day and repeated her plea:

"Please read this verse. Jesus will do a miracle for you." This time, he slapped her in anger.

Yet she came again a third time. Seeing her persistence despite all the insults and beatings, the boy softened a little. He took the Bible and placed it beside his bed.



A few days later, he curiously opened the book to see what it said. He began to read about Jesus—how He loved the people, had compassion on the sick, and healed them. As he kept reading, he couldn't stop. He was overwhelmed by the love and power of this Jesus. As he read, faith began to stir in his heart. He started to believe: "This Jesus, who is alive even after death, will surely heal me too." He began to pray earnestly to Jesus. God heard his prayer, touched him, and healed him completely. That deathbed became a place of divine healing.

That young man later became the founder of the world's largest church—Dr. Paul Yonggi Cho. It was the Word of God that birthed faith in him and led to his miracle.

Do you believe today? The same Jesus who performed miracles then is still performing miracles today. Will you believe?

lights our path.*



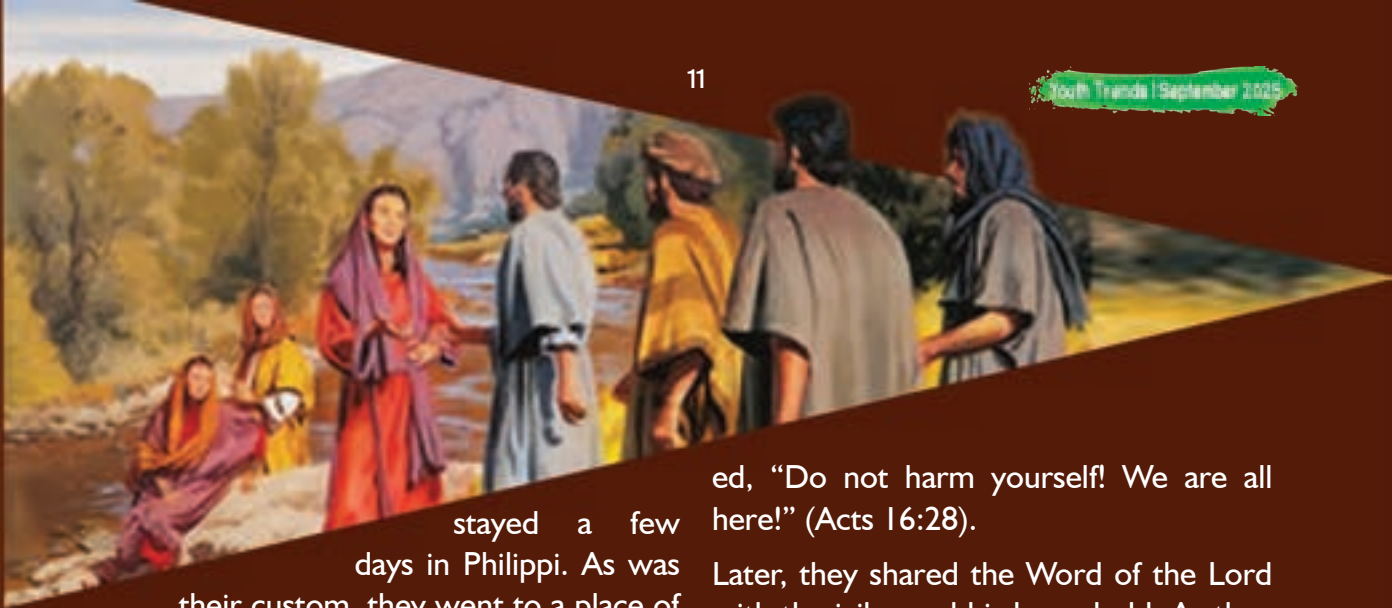
“Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path” (Psalm 119:105). When life feels confusing and unclear, it is the Word that illuminates the right direction.

When Scripture is treasured in your heart, you gain the wisdom to make sound decisions.

The Word, when deeply engraved in your mind and soul, keeps you from straying into sin and helps you walk in holiness. In moments of trial and sorrow, it is the Word that comforts and revives us. So, merely reading the Bible is not enough — we must hide it in our hearts. When God’s Word lives in our hearts, it protects us from falling into sin. King David expressed this beautifully from his own experience: “I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you” (Psalm 119:11). When the Word of God is rooted in our hearts, it becomes our strength in resisting sin.

If those bound in sin are to be set free, the Word of the Lord must be proclaimed among them. It pierces hearts, bringing repentance. Take the example of Paul and Silas, who





stayed a few days in Philippi. As was their custom, they went to a place of prayer by the riverside and shared the Gospel with the women gathered there. Among them was a woman named Lydia from Thyatira. As she listened attentively to the message spoken by Paul, the Lord opened her heart. She not only received Christ but was baptized along with her entire household. The Word of God brought life to those once dead in sin.

Even after Paul and Silas were imprisoned, they did not despair. Instead, they worshiped and sang praises to God. Suddenly, there was a great earthquake — the foundations of the prison shook, and all the doors flew open. When the jailer, thinking the prisoners had escaped, was about to kill himself, Paul shout-

ed, “Do not harm yourself! We are all here!” (Acts 16:28).

Later, they shared the Word of the Lord with the jailer and his household. As they heard the message, they believed and were baptized. Once again, the power of God’s Word led hearts to repentance and transformation.

In these last days — the days of famine for the Word — it is essential that God’s Word dwells richly within us. Only then can we boldly proclaim it to others. When Satan came to tempt Jesus, the Lord overcame every temptation by declaring the Word that was already stored in His heart. The Word within us brings life and power.

The Fig Tree Revived



Greetings, dear friends, in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ!

It brings me great joy to meet you once again through the biblical narrative titled “The Fig Tree Revived.”

Last month, we explored how the God of Israel fought on behalf of His people. This month, we will delve into the connection between Israel—the fig tree that revived again—and the ministry of Jesus Redeems.

Friends, I believe many of you are well-acquainted with the ministry of Jesus Redeems.

The Lord has graciously led this ministry for the past 46 years. For the last 20 years, through this ministry, we have been organizing annual prayer tours to Israel, with groups of 50 members. These teams are often composed of families who are closely united with the vision of Jesus Redeems. One of the most treasured moments during these tours is the time spent in prayer, both individually and corporately, at the Garden of Gethsemane.

In 2015, during one such trip, our beloved brother Mohan C. Lazarus was led to intercede at the Garden of Gethsemane for the peace of Israel. While he was praying, the Lord intervened

and spoke clearly, "How can there be peace in Israel without salvation?" He then pointed out the scripture which declares, "All Israel will be saved." The Lord gave a prophetic word stating, "The Israelites will be saved, and a revival fire will be poured out upon the land of Israel."

In obedience to the Lord's instruction; "You must labour for the revival of your land (India) and My land (Israel)" a vision was birthed, called The Israel Revival Prayer Tour.

The first such tour took place in 2016 with more than 400 believers joining together. During that trip, a 12-hour prayer meeting was held in Jerusalem. Additional intercessory gatherings took place for two hours each at significant biblical locations, such as the Sea of Galilee, Mount Carmel, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Garden Tomb, and Zedekiah's Cave.

The 12-hour prayer gathering in Jerusalem was especially profound. Bro. Mohan C. Lazarus and Bro. Vincent Selvakumar shared God's prophetic plans and scriptural visions for Israel and led the congregation in intense prayer. As a result, many received a deep burden for Israel and committed themselves to be intercessors for the nation.

Subsequent Revival Prayer Tours were held in 2017, 2018, 2019, and 2023. In each of these, participants dedicated themselves not only to pray for Israel but also to act on her behalf. In addition to these tours, Israel Revival Fasting

As a result of these prayers, the Lord commanded significant changes in the land of Israel. A great number of Jews came to know Jesus as the Messiah. The number of workers ministering among the people of Israel increased. Churches are growing and multiplying across the land. The Lord has raised more than 800 prayer cells within the nation. Believers from ten different countries are now faithfully praying for the salvation, revival, protection, and blessing of Israel.

I Am a Prayer Warrior

Dear brothers and sisters, from the very beginning of this year, we have been meditating on various dimensions of prayer. This month, we reflect on a unique kind of prayer that the early church offered on behalf of Peter.



Fervent Prayer

This was not the kind of prayer where one simply persists until the answer is received. Nor was it a desperate, drawn-out plea to obtain something by force. It was a fervent, faith-filled prayer—one that emerged from a heart united with the Lord's own heart and inspired by the Holy Spirit. In such moments, the Holy Spirit Himself intercedes from within us, teaching us how and what to pray. This speaks of a deep, earnest, and unceasing kind of prayer offered in the presence of God.

The church's fervent prayer for Peter is recorded in Acts chapter 12. Since Peter was a key leader in the early church, King Herod had him imprisoned. While Peter lay in prison, the church interceded on his behalf without ceasing, with passionate persistence. Their prayers reflected both their faith and their deep love for Peter.

Peter was chained and locked behind prison doors, unaware that a miraculous deliverance awaited him. Hence, he had removed his sandals and loosened his cloak, falling into sleep. But suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared, struck Peter on the side to wake him up, and said, "Gird yourself, put on your sandals, wrap your cloak around you, and follow me." Though Peter obeyed and followed the angel, he didn't realize what was happening was real—he thought he was having a vision. And why

wouldn't he? This was not something that could happen under normal circumstances. After all, four squads of soldiers had been specifically assigned to guard him.

So, in such a tightly guarded situation, how was it even possible for Peter to walk free?

It was possible because the church was praying for him fervently. Such is the power of prayer! On the very night before Peter was to be brought out for trial, the Lord sent His angel to rescue him from prison. Once Peter realized that it was truly the Lord who had delivered him, he went to the house where many believers were gathered in prayer. He found them still praying fervently. Their prayer had reached the throne room of God, and God had answered by setting Peter free.

Notice this: When Peter was imprisoned, the church did not run to King Herod, nor did they appeal to the prison guards, officials, or even those who accused Peter. Instead, they turned to the Lord and prayed with fervency. The Lord never ignores the prayer of the righteous; He never rejects passionate intercession. The Bible says, "The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much" (James 5:16). God responded to the fervent prayer of the church by sending His angel and miraculously delivering Peter.





We see a similar example in the life of Daniel. In Daniel 6:16, we read that he remained steadfast and fervent in prayer.

The God who rescued Daniel from the mouths of lions caused the king to publicly proclaim that He alone is the living God. Such was the magnitude of the miracle that even the king declared Daniel's God as the one true God.

Despite facing persecution and afflictions, those who remained fervent in prayer were victorious. The enemies who tried to destroy them were themselves defeated and put to shame by God (see Acts 12:22–23; Acts 16:28–39; Daniel 6:24).

Even today, no matter how many problems we may face, we need not fear. Our prayers will never go in vain. Let us persist in fervent, unceasing prayer unto the Lord—and He will turn our captivity around!

Alright then... Shall we dive into this month's story?

In the Bible, there's an account of a Roman centurion whose servant was gravely ill and on the verge of death. Deeply concerned, he longed for Jesus to heal his servant. Without hesitation, Jesus went with him. However, as they approached the house, the centurion sent word saying, "Lord, do not trouble Yourself, for I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof."

What incredible humility from a man so used to giving commands! He continued, "Just say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I too am a man under authority, having soldiers under me. I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it."

Farmers' Suicides

In the first three months of 2025 alone, 767 farmers took their own lives in Maharashtra. On average, eight farmers die by suicide each day in the state. India produces approximately 137.4 million tonnes of rice annually, with 25% of that yield coming from West Bengal. However, erratic rainfall, climate change, declining soil fertility, and pest infestations severely impact agricultural productivity. Low yields, mounting debts, and insufficient irrigation facilities have pushed many farmers to the brink. In 2024, a staggering 2,635 farmers in Maharashtra died by suicide.

Prayer Points:

1. Pray for the protection of farmers and for suicidal thoughts to be replaced with hope and courage.
2. Pray that the rice cultivated in India will be purchased at fair prices and that farmers will be able to sell their produce without facing losses.
3. Pray for divine intervention to protect farmlands from excessive rains and pests, and for a bountiful harvest.
4. Pray that the government would ensure adequate irrigation facilities and make fertilizers available at affordable rates.
5. Pray for uninterrupted electricity supply for agricultural needs.



Electricity Board

India's power sector employs around 2.7 million workers, serving over 333 million consumers. The nation consumes 1,800 terawatts of electricity per hour. The demand for electricity increases by 6% every year, with heavy usage in industries, households, and agriculture. Most of India's electricity is generated through thermal power plants, with hydropower, nuclear, and renewable energy sources contributing as well. It is projected that by 2029–2030, electricity generation will increase by 64%.

Prayer Points:

1. Pray for the salvation of the 2.7 million workers employed in the power sector.
2. Pray for a strong public awareness against the misuse and wastage of electricity.
3. Pray for complete electrification across all homes in India.
4. Pray for a significant increase in electricity production and for all vacant positions in power plants to be filled.
5. Pray for seamless electricity supply across the country and for the proper maintenance of power plants.



Sexual Assault Cases

In India, an average of 86 sexual assault cases are reported every day. Shockingly, in 82 of those cases, the perpetrator is someone known to the victim. Four sexual assault cases are filed every hour. Women between the ages of 18 and 30 are the most affected. Between 2017 and 2022, out of 189,000 reported cases, 113,000 victims were aged between 18 and 30. One in four girls is sexually abused before the age of 16. One in six children is a victim of sexual abuse. One in eighteen boys experiences sexual assault before the age of 16. In 2024 alone, 71,227 cases of sexual assault were officially registered by law enforcement.

Prayer Points:

1. Pray for judicial systems to take swift action to ensure timely resolution of sexual assault cases.
2. Pray for a divine transformation in this grim reality, where four cases are reported every hour.
3. Pray that survivors will receive emotional healing, and perpetrators will receive the punishment they deserve through the justice system.
4. Pray that restoration centres and support services will be available for women most affected.
5. Pray for awareness to be raised among young girls to protect them from sexual abuse from an early age.



Railway Sector

India operates 13,169 passenger trains and 8,739 freight trains. These trains cover a daily distance of 7,352 kilometres, employing about 1.2 million staff members. Over the past five years, 219 train accidents have occurred. In 2018–19, there were 59 accidents; in 2019–20, 55; in 2020–21, 22; in 2021–22, 35; and in 2022–23, 48 accidents. In 2023–24 alone, 313 passengers lost their lives and over 1,000 were injured. Over the past decade, India has witnessed 638 railway accidents, resulting in 748 deaths and injuries to over 1,500 individuals. The railway network spans over 106,000 kilometres, connecting every state across the nation.

Prayer Points:

1. Pray for the safety and protection of the 1.2 million employees working in the railway sector.
2. Pray for government intervention to prevent railway accidents and to upgrade railway tracks.
3. Pray that long-distance train drivers will have reduced working hours and that vacant posts will be filled to manage the workload.
4. Pray for the removal of signalling errors and the establishment of adequate safety barriers.
5. Pray that the railway system will function with wisdom and excellence to prevent further loss of life.





The Tabernacle

The Lord Himself chose priests to minister in the Tabernacle. This month, we will reflect on the sacred duties entrusted to them.

The Lord said to the people of Israel: “You will be My treasured possession. You shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation” (Exodus 19:5–6).

The Lord separated the Levites from among the tribes of Israel. From the Levites, He chose Aaron and his descendants, consecrated them as priests, and anointed them for service in the Holy Place.

The Priests' Sacrificial Duties

The priest was responsible for offering sacrifices before the Lord to atone for the people's sins.

The morning offering: Each morning he laid wood upon the altar and kept the fire burning. He dressed in linen garments to remove the ashes from the altar and placed them beside it. Then, changing into other garments, he carried the ashes outside the camp to a ceremonially clean place. The fire on the altar was never to go out.

The sprinkling of blood: The priest smeared the blood of the sacrifice on the horns of the altar and poured the rest at its base. **The lampstand:** In the Holy Place, he kept the lamp burning continually from evening until morning before the Lord.

The Table of Showbread: He arranged the holy bread every Sabbath and offered incense before the Lord.

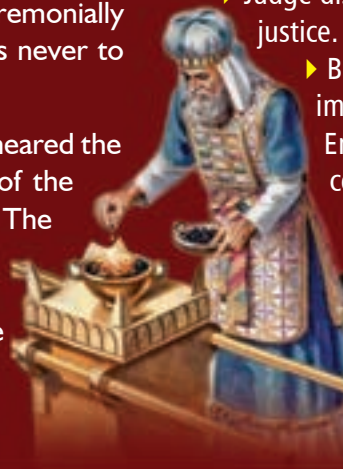
The Most Holy Place: Once a year, the high priest alone entered the Holy of Holies. Carrying sacrificial blood, he sprinkled it once on the atonement cover (mercy seat) and seven times in front of it, making atonement for all the sins of Israel.

Priestly Responsibilities among the People

- ▶ Publicly read the Law of God for all Israel to hear.
- ▶ Teach the people about leprosy and how to distinguish it.
- ▶ Declare the clean person “purified” when the disease was gone.
- ▶ Judge disputes and proclaim the Lord's justice.

▶ Blow the trumpets to signal important events.
Encourage the people with words of courage before they went into battle.

Aaron and his sons were appointed to perform these ministries. In Deuteronomy 10:8 we read of three key priestly roles:



1. To Carry the Ark of the Covenant

When Israel broke camp, the consecrated priests bore the Ark of the Covenant. In the same way, we too are called to bear the Word of the Lord—His power and glory—as His living ark in this world.

2. To Stand before the Lord and Worship Him

When God called Israel out of Egypt, He commanded Pharaoh, “Let My people go, that they may worship Me.” Concerning us also, God says, “I have formed this people for Myself, that they might declare My praise.”



Therefore, as those who have received an unshakable kingdom, let us hold firmly to grace and offer worship to God with reverence and holy fear, pleasing Him in all things.

3. To Bless in His Name

It is God’s delight to bless His people through His priests. Scripture tells us, “You were called to inherit a blessing; therefore, bless.” As priests of the last days, we must intercede through Jesus Christ—the One sacrificed for the sins of humanity—that all people may be sanctified and inherit the blessings of heaven.

Through the Word of God, we must proclaim the gospel to every soul.

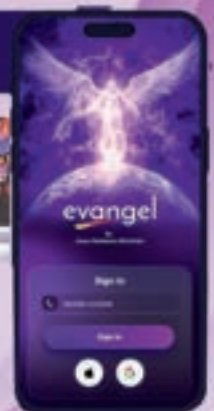

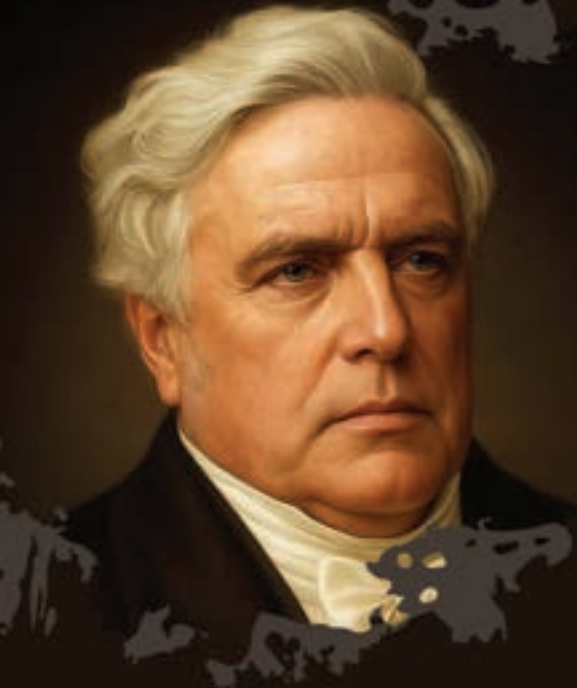

Revival Seeds



Dear young brother and sister,

We are living in the days of the end-time revival! Every month, through this column “Revival Seeds”, we explore the lives of missionaries who, in the midst of great hardship, sowed the seeds of revival. This month, let us delve into the inspiring life of a missionary who toiled tirelessly for the establishment of Christ’s Kingdom - **John Thomas Tucker**.

Born on November 10, 1807, in Ireland, John Thomas Tucker was raised in a home where he was nurtured in devotion and discipline from a young age. At the age of 19, he aspired to become a prominent lawyer. Pursuing this dream, he studied law and began practicing as an advocate. Even in his youth, he actively engaged in evangelistic ministry.

In 1827, during a missionary conference conducted by the Church Mission Society in Ireland, he felt the divine calling to dedicate his entire life to spreading the Gospel. Yielding to that call, he gave up his flourishing legal career and enrolled in a Bible college in London in 1833. He completed his theological studies and was ordained on June 5, 1836, in England.

That same year, through CMS Mission, John Thomas was sent to Chennai (then Madras). In just six months, he mastered the Tamil language and, on February 5, 1837, began his missionary work in the village of Megnanapuram in Tirunelveli district. On October 4, 1838, he married Mary Davis. Together, they traveled on foot to various villages, proclaiming the Gospel. The couple was blessed with three children.

The areas where John ministered were barren and impoverished. He undertook the task of improving agricultural lands, planting trees suitable to the local soil, purifying the villages, and transforming dry wastelands into lush groves. Witnessing his compassionate efforts, the locals—many of whom were toddy tappers—listened to the Gospel and accepted Jesus Christ. For them, he built a small church.

In 1844, he started a school and also constructed hostels for orphans and abandoned children. As a result, many who had never heard of Jesus came to faith and began sending their children to school. The students excelled not only academically but also in character. Numerous villagers around Megnanapuram accepted Jesus. John baptized them and appointed catechists to lead morning and evening worship in their communities.

But his work wasn’t without fierce opposition. Opponents who resented his social reforms and evangelism set fire to the thatched churches. They destroyed Christian homes, properties, and farmlands, socially ostracizing believers. Yet, the Christians endured all this with unwavering patience. In their suffering, they

clung to God more firmly and grew stronger in faith. None turned away from Christ, which only deepened the enemies' fury.

In 1845, severe cyclonic winds battered Megnanapuram and its surrounding villages. This was followed by deadly outbreaks of cholera, vomiting, and diarrhea. A brutal famine and acute drinking water shortage made matters worse. Death cries echoed everywhere. Among the many losses, John Thomas also lost his beloved daughter, Mary Jane.

Locals began blaming these tragedies on the people's conversion to Christianity. Violence erupted. Threats mounted. They demanded that John Thomas cease his missionary work. But undeterred and unafraid—even amidst personal grief—he continued ministering to the afflicted with renewed zeal. He visited village after village, offering help and hope. His wife too stepped in, organizing self-help groups for women and empowering them economically. She established a school to educate girls.

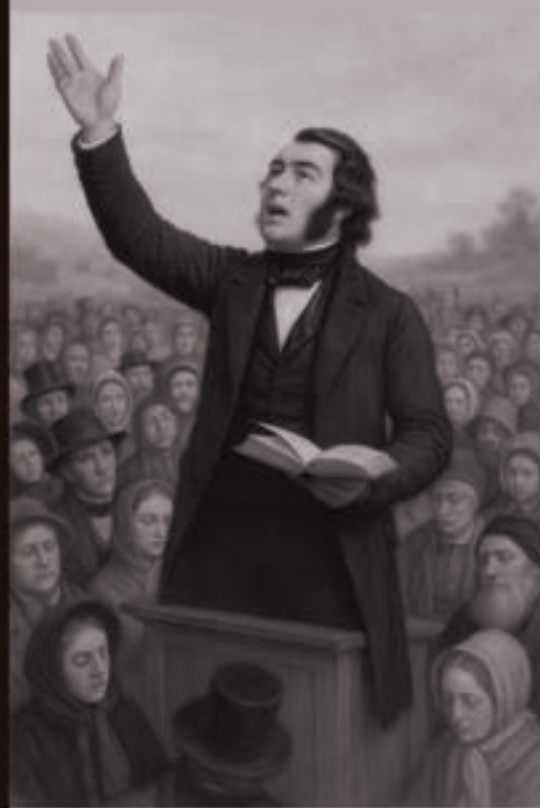
Through these evangelistic, social, and women's empowerment efforts, many villagers embraced Jesus Christ as their personal Savior. To facilitate corporate worship, plans were made to build a church. Construction began on June 20, 1844, and on December 9, 1847, the church was completed and consecrated under the name **St. Paul's Church**.

In 1857, the Christian population in Megnanapuram stood at 5,500. By 1869, that number had grown to **45,000!**

John Thomas also built large churches in villages such as Vellalanvilai, Arumuganeri, Nalumavadi, Kadatchapuram, Kayamozhi, Prakasapuram, Pannavilai, and Christian Nagar. In Subramaniapuram, Rasamanipuram, and Poovarasur—villages inhabited by marginalized communities—churches were constructed as well. He preached the Gospel in **125 villages**, built churches, and also established **54 schools**.

He trained **54 evangelists** and appointed **preachers** for church ministry. To strengthen the believers, he ordained **12 pastors**. Owing to his tireless labor, the churches flourished and grew deeply rooted in the faith.

After 33 years of ceaseless service, dedicating his entire life to Megnanapuram and its surrounding regions, John Thomas became physically weak in 1865. He went to England for medical treatment and slightly recovered. Yet, unable to bear separation from the love and affection of the people of Megnanapuram, he insisted on returning. He vowed, "Even



in death, I wish to be among the people of South Tirunelveli." Eventually, his health deteriorated again, and on **March 28, 1870**, at the age of 62, he entered into eternal rest.

Artificial Intelligence Usage leads to 47% Decline in Brain's Cognitive Ability - Shocking Study Reveals

India Sets New UPI Record with ₹70.70 Crore Transactions in a single day!

India has witnessed a major milestone in digital transactions through the Unified Payments Interface (UPI). On August 2, ₹70.70 crore worth of transactions were carried out in a single day, as confirmed by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). This marks a new record in UPI usage across the country.



Compared to 2023, the number of UPI transactions transaction volume, which stood at ₹35 crore, increased to ₹50 crore by August 2024. And now, it has surged to ₹70 crore. In July alone, daily transactions were around ₹65 crore, but on August 2, it crossed the ₹70 crore mark for the first time.

Popular digital payment platforms such as Google Pay, PhonePe, Paytm, Amazon Pay, and BHIM have significantly contributed to this surge. 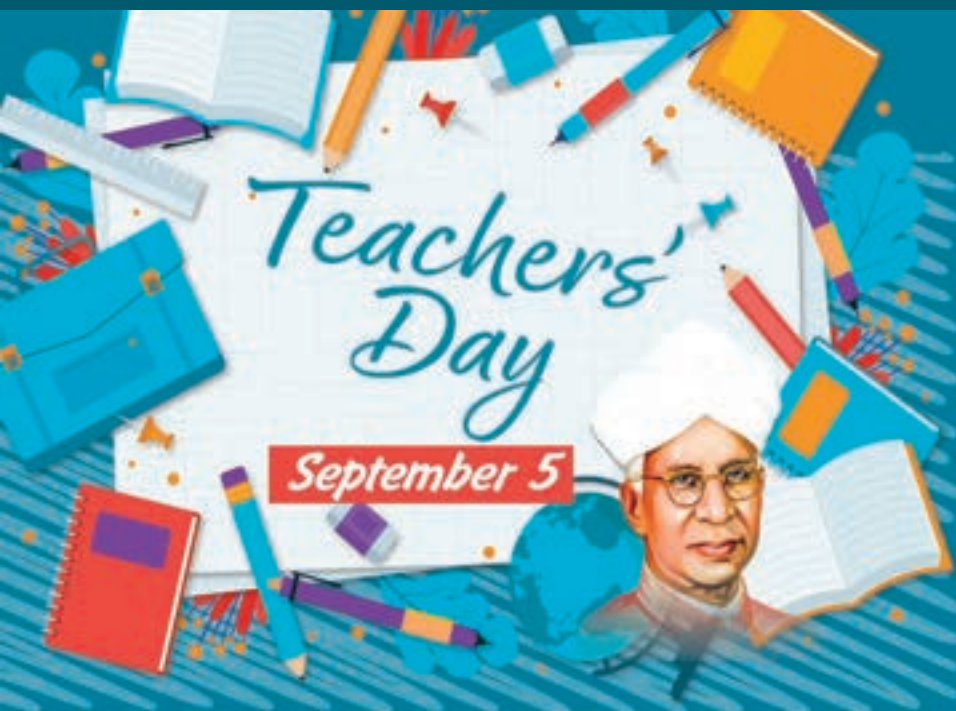
Starting today, let's change our trend — let us cast off what is displeasing to God and embrace a worship that is pleasing in His sight.
