

to pray. My prayer life grew longer and deeper.

I also had a longing to receive the anointing of the Holy Spirit, so I prayed earnestly for it.

was shattered. Words spoken by those I loved broke my heart. It was then I realized that human love is fragile and temporary.

Those you loved as brothers hurt you deeply. Did you find another relationship that healed this wound?

Yes. When I was crushed by that pain, I went to the Lord and wept: "Lord, those I loved as brothers have hurt me." I cried, confessing, "Jesus, this whole world is an illusion. People love only for their own gain. But I forgot You—the One who gives true love. I no longer need worldly love; You alone are enough for me."

As I prayed, Jesus gently reminded me of my sins and led me to confess them. I wept, "Lord, I have wasted so many years. I have sinned and grieved You." I surrendered completely, confessing all my sins, and on May 19, 2019, I accepted Jesus as my personal Savior and dedicated my life fully to Him. That was the day I was saved. From that moment onward, Jesus became my Elder Brother, guiding me step by step.

Wonderful! After accepting Jesus as your Savior, how did your relationship with Him grow?

Until then, my prayer time was just five minutes. I didn't know I should pray for my nation, for the perishing souls, or for revival. Then

I also had a longing to receive the anointing of the Holy Spirit, so I prayed earnestly for it. After my salvation, I began reading and meditating on the Bible. God's Word molded me day by day, shaping me like clay in the Potter's hands. As I read, I learned how I should live and how I should not. My love for the Word kept increasing.

Whenever I was burdened, it was the Bible that wiped my tears and guided my steps. Through the Word, I began to taste and see that the Lord is good.

That's beautiful! You learned to pray and delight in God's Word. Did you receive the anointing you longed for?

Yes! At the Igniters Camp, the Lord anointed me. He filled me with the gift of tongues, the anointing for spiritual warfare, and the power to share the Gospel. During the pandemic, I spent much time with Jesus. Those moments



brought me great joy, because I experienced the reality of speaking with God and hearing Him speak to me. Since accepting Jesus, my sinful nature has changed. He transformed me into a new creation.

Amazing! After Grade 12, were you able to continue your studies?

Initially, I tried to prepare for NEET exams, but I didn't succeed. Then I considered Nursing, but the fees were far too

high. I prayed earnestly about what course to pursue. By August, I began to fear that I would waste a whole year. When I enquired at a nearby college about B.Sc. Mathematics, admissions were already closed. They then mentioned that two seats were still available in Engineering. But the fees were ₹30,000 a year, plus bus fare. Since my father was the only earning member of our family, we could not afford it.

I cried out, "Jesus, how can we ever pay such fees?" I wasn't even praying properly; I was just pouring out my fear before Him. At that very moment, the college called me. They said, "Since you have scored above 500 marks, you don't need to pay any tuition fees—only the bus fees. Please come and confirm your admission immediately."

My joy knew no bounds! When I went for admission, the Principal looked at my mark sheet but said nothing. Yet before I could even finish telling Jesus my problem, He had already provided the answer—doing far more for me than even a brother could have done.

Hallelujah! What a miracle! How did your studies go after that?

Since I came from a Tamil-medium background, studying Engineering in English was very difficult at first. But when I prayed



for wisdom, the Lord promised to give me the same wisdom He gave Solomon. And He did!

God helped me to win many medals and shields. I secured the second rank in my department. In my final semester, I was chosen as the team leader for my project. I had no idea what to do, but when I prayed, the Lord guided me wonderfully, enabling me to win the Best Paper Presentation Award.

Once, I was a failure. But when I held on to Him, God lifted me up and gave me victory after victory.

Amazing! God has blessed you so much in your studies. In return, what did you do for Him?

At the Igniters Camp, I was taught that every believer must serve the Lord. There, God also anointed me with the anointing of evangelism. Mohan Uncle encouraged

us, saying that even while studying, we can serve God. I felt a burden to share the Gospel, but I was timid and afraid of both spiritual warfare and evangelism.

The Lord trained me patiently. Since I was hesitant to go out and share the Gospel directly, God used my mobile phone instead. Each morning, during my personal prayer, He would give me a verse. I would post it as my WhatsApp status, praying: "Lord Jesus, may at least one soul be saved through this verse."

As a result, my Tamil teacher read these words and accepted Jesus. My gentile friends also said, "This verse speaks to me." In this way, I began to share the Gospel. Later, I joined with others to evangelize as a group.

Because of this, God blessed not only my spiritual life but also my worldly life in many ways.

Finally, what is your message to young people?

Dear youth, love everyone, but don't place your trust in people. Only Jesus is worthy of your full trust. Parents and friends may not



always be with you, but the Lord will be your Father, your Mother, your Friend—your everything.

No matter what your sin is, if you come to Jesus, He will cleanse you. In every matter, talk to Him first in prayer. Love the Bible. Never stop reading it, for the Word will lead you in the right path.

Beloved youth, many accept Jesus as their Father or Mother. But Sister Gracelin uniquely embraced Him as her Elder Brother. Perhaps you too feel that a certain relationship is missing in your life. Don't be disheartened. Jesus will be your Brother, helping you in every way. Keep Him always before you. With Him at your right hand, you will never be shaken.

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Jost on the WRONG LANE


I am 28 years old. I first started chewing tobacco with my friends when I was in Grade II, without my family or school knowing. Later, during college, I began experimenting with stronger substances along with the same group of friends. Now I find myself fully addicted, and my entire life has become a question mark. I can't hold a job. My own family has pushed me away because my friends and I have been involved in fights, accidents, and even police cases while under the influence. My sister's marriage proposals have been blocked because people ask, "How can we marry our daughter into this family when her brother lives like this?" I have a younger sister too, and our whole household is breaking apart. I want to come out of this addiction, but my friends force me to stay in it. I truly want to change, but I feel powerless. What should I do?

Dear Michael,

I understand your situation. On one side, you're in pain because you feel trapped in this addiction. On the other, you're burdened with guilt because it's affecting your family, especially your sisters' future. What started as a casual habit with friends has now turned into a destructive bondage.

But hear this clearly: **no sinful habit is impossible to break.** You must first believe with certainty that you can come out of this.



Also understand this — a true friend is someone who pulls you away from a wrong path, not someone who pushes you into it. Anyone forcing you into sin is not your friend. Such people can't fix your problems; they'll only deepen them.

Wanting freedom is good, but desire alone is not enough. You need determination, discipline, and perseverance.

If you continue because of peer pressure...

- You'll remain unable to work, and your future will sink even deeper.
- This addiction could eventually lead you to prison and public disgrace.

- Your family situation will worsen; bitterness may grow between you and your sisters.
- Like your older sister, your younger sister's future may also be affected.
- Your health will deteriorate, and frustration could drive you toward dangerous decisions.



If you break free despite your friends' pressure...

- Your life, which now feels like a question mark, will take a new direction.
- You'll regain dignity and respect as you begin earning and building a stable future.
- Your sister's marriage prospects will open up, and your family will start to heal.
- Though you may lose your friends' approval, you'll gain your family's love.
- Guilt will be replaced by peace and joy.

Steps to break this bondage

- ▶ Cut off toxic friendships completely: Block every contact that enables this addiction.
- Avoid isolation: Addictions grow strongest in lonely moments. Keep yourself surrounded by healthy influences.
- ▶ Consider relocating: Sometimes a change of place can create a fresh start.
- ▶ Replace darkness with light: Don't just think, "I must quit drugs." Instead, engage in sports, family activities, or creative pursuits to redirect your mind.
- > Turn to Jesus Christ: He is ready to

forgive your sins, free you from this bondage, and adopt you as His child. Scripture says, "Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses



and renounces them finds mercy" (Proverbs 28:13). Confess your sins, receive His grace, and begin a new life!.

But what does the Bible say? "Be an example in doing good." The good works of a child of God must stand apart from the good works of the world.



— study hard, land a great job, rise quickly.

But reality hit hard. *His job applications*

When Rejection Became His Training Ground

Most people would have quit. Nikesh didn't. Instead of treating rejection as a dead end, he saw it as training for greatness.

Finally, his persistence paid off
— he became Vice President at
Fidelity Investments. Google

spotted his talent and made him Head of EMEA Operations, later promoting him to **Chief Business Officer**.

Soon after, SoftBank Group appointed him **President and CEO.** And in 2018, he took charge as CEO and Chairman of **Palo Alto Networks**, earning global recognition as a top leader in the tech industry. By 2023, his annual compensation reached \$151.4 million, placing him among the **highest-paid CEOs** in the **United States**.

Failure Isn't the Finish Line — It's Fuel

Friends, here's the takeaway: 400 rejections didn't stop him — they shaped him.

Nikesh Arora kept getting up, again and again, refusing to let failure define his future.
Rejection is not the end. It's a classroom

where success gives you your first lessons. If

running toward

Prayer that refuses to quit. Prayer rooted in faith and hope. That's what unyielding prayer looks like. The Bible introduces us to many who prayed in unique ways — each with a story of breakthrough. Last month, we reflected on how the church's fervent prayer released Peter from prison. This month, let's discover how Daniel's steadfast prayer life turned impossible situations into glorious victories.

Daniel's Unshakable Prayer Life

Consistent devotion: Even when King Darius banned prayer to any god but himself, Daniel knelt down three times a day to pray as usual

(Daniel 6:10). His commitment spoke louder than any royal decree.

- **Bold transparency:** Daniel prayed openly with his windows facing Jerusalem (Daniel 6:10), showing he had nothing to hide about his devotion.
- Fearless faith: Even when thrown into the lions' den, Daniel never abandoned prayer. His faith in God remained unshaken (Daniel 6:23).

Daniel teaches us that prayer is not an emergency tool for crisis moments - it's a lifestyle.

Uncompromising Integrity

Daniel's challenges weren't just about prayer - they were about character.



- ▶ He refused to defile himself with royal food and wine, choosing purity over privilege (Daniel 1:8–17).
- He stood for truth even when it was costly.
- He and his friends remained faithful to God despite pressure to conform, even when their Hebrew names were replaced with pagan ones.
- Daniel's unwavering heart for God made him stand out in a foreign land - and heaven honored him for it.

Victory in the Lions' Den

Daniel's faith silenced the roar of lions. The very king who signed his death warrant testified:

"The God whom you serve continually is able to deliver you!" (Daniel 6:16)

And He did. Daniel emerged unharmed, proving that God rescues those who trust Him. As a result, King Darius glorified God publicly:

"He is the living God... He rescues and saves... He performs signs and wonders in heaven and on earth." (Daniel 6:26–27)

Daniel's steadfast prayer and faith turned danger into a divine display of power.

Unstoppable Miracles of the Bible

The Bible records moments where faith shook the very laws of nature. Joshua prayed, and the sun stood still over Gibeon while the moon paused over Aijalon, right before Israel's eyes. Elijah called down fire from heaven, proving to the crowd that the Lord alone is God. Jesus spoke to raging winds and violent





waves, commanding them to be still—and they obeyed.

These wonders defied science, overturned natural order, and turned entire multitudes back to God.

Thomas: From Doubt to Daring Faith

Even Thomas—often nicknamed "Doubting Thomas"—performed a breathtaking miracle through unwavering faith.

One day in Palayur, Kerala near a temple pond, he saw people performing rituals for their ancestors. They scooped water with their hands and threw it skyward, praying it would somehow reach those who had passed on.

Thomas challenged them: "Why does the water you throw keep falling back down? If your



god truly hears you, why doesn't he accept your offering? But the God I serve not only hears my prayer—He will give you a sign. He will make this water remain suspended in the air!"

He looked toward heaven, prayed to Jesus, stepped into the pond, and threw water upward in faith. To everyone's amazement, the water hung midair like blossoms frozen in time. Even the spot where he scooped water formed a small hollow in the pond, as though nature itself acknowledged the miracle.

The event spread through the entire town like wildfire. People rushed to see it with their own eyes. Convinced by this wonder, about 1,050 people accepted Christ and were baptized. The very place of this miracle still exists in Palayur, Kerala—a living witness to what bold faith can do.

Modern Times: The Kanyakumari Red Alert Miracle

You might wonder—can such miracles still happen today? Here's proof.

A few years ago, a massive prayer meeting was planned in Kanyakumari district, with a well-known servant of God scheduled to share the Word. Preparations began months in advance. But just two days before the event, torrential rains pounded several districts of Tamil Nadu, including Kanyakumari. A Red Alert was issued—flood risk, danger everywhere.

Despite the crisis, believers all over Tamil Nadu began praying earnestly. The man of God also sought the Lord, who clearly said, "Go to that district—I will come and perform mighty wonders there."

With this assurance, he went forward. Incredibly, the three-day gathering took place without a single disruption. While the whole region waited to see disaster, the Red Alert in Kanyakumari was suddenly lifted. The danger passed.

And that wasn't all—during the prayer meeting, God worked supernatural signs and wonders, transforming countless lives. This was a powerful testimony that faith-filled prayer can bring even nature under God's command.

Called to More than Just Hearing about Miracles

Wow—aren't these wonders absolutely astonishing? But these are not stories to simply hear and admire. God hasn't chosen us just to listen to such miracles—He has called us to live them.

That's why He has given us precious faith. But here's the question:


Are we growing in it? How strong is our measure of faith today?

Casual belief won't do. These are the fruits of rock-solid, unwavering faith-a faith sharpened by a costly prayer life and an unquenchable desire to be used by God. Only strong, steadfast faith combined with sacrificial prayer will open the door to such mighty works.

So let's pray. Let's act. Let's rise with a hunger to do impossible things for the Lord. The world is waiting to see what happens when faith takes command!

The Tabernacle



Aaron was appointed as the chief among priests—honored with the title of High Priest. To clothe his priestly office with dignity and splendor, the Lord commanded that sacred garments be fashioned for him (Exodus 28:2,4).

As the Lord instructed, Moses consecrated Aaron and his sons: he washed them with water, clothed Aaron with the tunic, tied the sash, placed the robe and the ephod upon him, secured the skillfully woven waistband, and set the breastpiece on his chest. Inside the breastpiece he placed the Urim and Thummim. A turban was placed upon his head, and on it a golden plate engraved with the words "Holiness to the Lord." Let us look at the meaning of these garments, each divinely designed:

The Ephod: The ephod, overlaid with gold and woven with blue, purple, scarlet yarn, and fine linen, was worn only by the High Priest. The very word ephod means praise. It reminds us that our first duty is to praise God for His mighty works. On its shoulders were mounted two onyx stones, each engraved with six names of the tribes of Israel. The priest carried them upon his shoulders—symbolizing the call to intercede, support, and bear the burdens of God's

The Breast piece of Judgment: Square and folded double, the breast piece was set with twelve precious stones, each engraved with the name of

people.

a tribe of Israel. Worn over the heart, it signified the priest's call to love God's people deeply (Exodus 39:8–21).

Inside were placed the Urim and Thummim (Exodus 28:30). These black and white stones were sacred instruments through which God's will was revealed, answering with a divine "yes" or "no." Urim means light—reminding us that God's Word is a lamp to our feet (Psalm 119:105). Thummim means perfection—pointing to the fullness of the Holy Spirit (John 16:13).

The Robe: The priest's robe was blue, with alternating pomegranates and golden bells along its hem. The pomegranates symbolized fruitfulness, while the bells represented power and spiritual gifts—both essential in the life of God's servant.

The Tunic: The inner tunic was plain and white, simple and without ornament. This symbolized humility, purity, and a life of gentleness and simplicity.

The Turban and Crown: The priest wore a linen turban encircled around his head, covering both head and ears. This showed that he was not to minister by human wisdom or listen to mere human words, but to be attentive only to the voice of the Lord. Fastened to the front of the turban



was a golden plate inscribed with "Holy to the This Lord." declared openly that the priest was set apart for God alone.

The Sash: The sash bound

all the holy garments together and enabled Aaron to stand rightly before God. In the same way, we too must gird ourselves with the belt of truth and stand firm in faith.

Lessons for Us Today

When the priest stood before the people, he was clothed in radiant, costly garments. Likewise, before the world we are called to be clothed with strength, spiritual gifts, and divine wisdom.

Yet, when the priest entered the Most Holy Place before God, he wore only simple linen garments (Leviticus 16:4). This teaches us that before God, we must walk in humility (Micah 6:8). As Aaron was clothed in holy garments, so too, by the blood of Jesus, we are made priests. We must put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness (Ephesians 4:24). And for these last days, we are called to clothe ourselves with the full armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-17).





Join us every month without fail: Become catalysts of a mighty revival! Last month, we reflected on the life of John Thomas, who, like a grain of wheat falling to the ground, labored tirelessly for 33 years in Meignanapuram and its surrounding 125 villages-proclaiming the Gospel, building 54 schools and many churches, and winning countless souls for Christ despite fierce opposition and personal loss. This month, let us turn our attention to another remarkable servant of God-a missionary who prayed like Caleb of old: "Give me this mountain" (Joshua 14:12). With the same spirit, he pleaded, "Lord, send me to the hardest mission field on earth. There I will serve You." That missionary was Robert Morrison, the pioneer who carried the Gospel light into China.

Robert Morrison: The Torchbearer to China

Early Life

Robert Morrison was born in England in 1782 as the eighth child in his family. From a young age, he assisted his father in a wood-engraving factory. Through the influence of his devout father, Robert spent his leisure hours reading the Bible. While most boys preferred games, Robert devoted his time to learning the Scriptures under his pastor's guidance. At the age of 14, he left school to train in his father's trade.

The Call of God

At 15, Robert experienced a deep conversion and began to grow daily in his walk with Christ. Reading missionary journals stirred his heart with a burden for foreign lands that had never heard of Jesus. He longed to go himself as a missionary.

Yet his mother opposed the idea strongly, declaring that as long as she lived, Robert must never leave home. But Robert continued to pray. When his mother passed away in 1802, he entered missionary training in London for two years and was soon accepted by the London Missionary Society.

Though opportunities for ministry abounded in England, Robert's heart burned for China.


The Journey to China

In 1807, with no fellow laborers available, the Society decided to send Robert alone to China. The East India Company refused him permission to travel or settle there. Determined, Robert first sailed to America, secured letters of recommendation, and then boarded an American ship bound for Canton (now Guangzhou). After a seven-month voyage, he arrived in September 1807.

BERTHAM BERTHAM

Suspicion and hostility met him at every turn. Preaching the Gospel openly was forbidden. Learning the Chinese lan-

guage itself was considered dangerous. His first tutors even warned him: "If the authorities discover us teaching you, we will be tortured. We keep poison ready to end our lives before capture."



Trials and Family Sorrows

In China, Robert married Mary Morton, daughter of an English physician. But the harsh climate soon took a toll on her health. In 1815, she returned to England with their two children. When she rejoined Robert in 1821, her health failed again, and she passed away soon after. Their children, Rebecca (9) and John (7), were sent back to England for education. Grieving deeply, Robert poured his lonely hours into translating the Scriptures.

The Mission Work

In 1815, he published the New Testament in Chinese. This act cost him his employment with the East India Company. Undeterred, he pressed forward. In 1824, after years of toil, Robert completed and published the entire Bible in Chinese—the first of its kind.

During a visit to England, he trained young missionaries and conducted classes for women who felt called to serve in

> China. Many of these women later carried the Gospel into that vast land.

In 1826, he returned to Canton, continuing both translation and mediation work between Britain and

China. The burden, however, weakened his body. On August 1, 1834, after 25 years of grueling labor in China, Robert Morrison went to be with the Lord. His converts were few, but his translation of the Bible laid an eternal foundation for the spread of the Gospel in China.

A Legacy for Us

Dear young friends, missionaries like Robert Morrison counted even family, comforts, and life itself as nothing compared to the cause of Christ. Because they burned for God, nations once shrouded in darkness now shine with the light of the Gospel.

Their lives remind us that it is only when the seed falls to the ground and dies that a harvest can spring forth. Will you, like Robert Morrison, be willing to take up the hardest fields that multitudes might be prepared for eternity?

One-Third of Deaths in India Caused by Heart Disease: Study Report Released

A shocking study has revealed that one in every three deaths in India is due to heart-related illnesses. The Registrar General of India has published a report analyzing the causes of death across the country between 2021 and 2023.

According to the findings, 56.7% of deaths were attributed to non-communicable diseases. Meanwhile, 23.4% of deaths were linked to communicable diseases, maternal and neonatal complications, and nutritional deficiencies.



Alarmingly, 31% of the deaths were caused by cardiovascular conditions. Following this, respiratory infections accounted for 9.3%, tumors for 6.4%, other respiratory complications for 5.7%, digestive disorders for 5.3%, fevers for 4.9%, road accidents and injuries for 3.7%, diabetes for 3.5%, and genitourinary diseases for 3%. Additionally, 10.5% of deaths were categorized as having no clearly identified cause.

Among individuals aged 15 to 29, self-inflicted injuries and suicide were reported as the most common causes of death. In contrast, unexplained deaths were predominantly observed in people aged 70 and above. (Source: Dinakaran, September 6)


The Suffering of Children in Gaza: 21,000 Have Lost Natural Abilities, Says UN

Due to relentless Israeli attacks, nearly 21,000 children in Gaza have lost basic abilities and have been rendered disabled, according to a United Nations agency for persons with disabilities.

The report further states that around 40,500 children have been injured during the conflict, with nearly half of them losing vital functions such as hearing, speech, or vision. Severe malnutrition is also afflicting children in Gaza. If the current situation continues, approximately 132,000 children face the risk of death by June 2026, according to the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification system.

Since the onset of the conflict, over 63,700 people have been killed and more than 161,000 injured, as reported by the region's health department.
