A Rebel to a Revival Carrier

Born in the city of Bangalore,
Brother Mani Abraham was once
enslaved to worldly entertainment
— addicted to Reels, TikTok, and a life
filled with violence and sin. But one
divine encounter turned his story
around completely. Let's hear
from him how God
touched and
transformed his life.



My name is Mani Abraham, and I work in a private courier company in Bangalore. I was born into a family that did not know Jesus. I have two elder brothers and one elder sister. When my eldest brother was a little boy, his leg swelled up, and he couldn't walk. A Christian family living near our home told my mother, "If you go to church and pray, your son will be healed."

My mother took my brother to church and prayed, and the Lord miraculously healed him! That miracle opened her eyes — she realized that Jesus is the true God. From that day onward, she accepted Jesus as her personal Savior and began leading all of us to follow Christ.

How was your childhood?

My mother was a woman of deep faith and devotion. She never missed church and brought us along every week. But to be



honest, I didn't go willingly — I went only because my mother insisted. My mind was always on worldly things. On Sundays, all I could think about was watching movies. As soon as the church service ended, I would run off to the theatre or go out with friends. That was my routine life.

What about your school days?

When I entered high school, my behavior, attitude, and even my dressing style began to change. I was made the class leader, which filled me with pride. I misused that position. I started thinking, "Everyone listens to me — that means I have power. If I'm a leader, everyone must obey me. So why not become a rowdy?"

I began carrying a small knife in my school bag. I would jokingly show it to my friends, pretending to stab them, just to prove I was bold. My family knew nothing about this. My language became filthy, and I used to fight and curse freely. That was how my teenage years went.

How about your college?

When I joined college, I had many friends — but unfortunately, all of them were just like me: aggressive and violent. During the lockdown period, this behavior only grew worse. If we saw a fight anywhere, we'd jump in to beat others up.

Sometimes, even if I didn't like someone, I would intentionally start a fight.

I always had three or four boys hanging around with me. I wanted at least ten people under me — I wanted to be known as the leader of rowdies! I even began reading about famous gangsters and felt inspired by their stories. At the same time, I became addicted to TikTok and Reels. I made videos every day, and when people liked and commented, I felt thrilled. It became an obsession. My days revolved around posting, watching, and craving more likes.

How did your life turn toward God?

Though I lived a sinful life, I still went to church occasionally. But it was all routine — no personal prayer, no Bible reading, no family devotion. I only prayed during exams, out of fear. I didn't have any real relationship with Jesus.

In 2022, my sister's daughter suddenly fell sick. We took her to several hospitals in our city, but nothing worked. Our family was heartbroken and in tears. Out of desperation, we called the Jesus Redeems prayer line and requested prayer. They told us about the "Come Let's Pray" program, and we started watching it regularly.

During one episode, Bro. Mohan C. Lazarus prayed first for forgiveness of sins and then for miracles. When he said, "Lay your hands on the sick and pray," I placed my hand on my niece and prayed. Then suddenly, I heard Mohan uncle say, "Take your hand away. Your sin is standing in the way of this miracle."

Those words pierced my heart. I went aside, knelt down, and began to confess all my sins before God. That day, I felt a deep peace I had never experienced before — a joy that made me feel as if I was flying in the sky! I knew for sure that my sins were forgiven. From that day onward, I started watching Come Let's Pray program regularly, listening to God's Word, and praying daily. My family also began having family prayer together. I, who once couldn't pray even ten minutes, began spending hours in prayer.



A New Calling

Later, I attended the Igniters Camp at Nalumavadi. For three days, I was taught about revival and the coming of Jesus in a deep and powerful way. There, I received a new anointing and committed myself to serve the Lord in my hometown. From that moment, my life changed completely.

Now, apart from my job, I serve in Gospel ministry. The Lord has also given me the privilege to serve alongside our church pastor. Truly, God has transformed my entire life.

What would you like to say to today's youth?

Dear young people, if you will surrender your life to God, remove the things that displease Him, and listen to His voice, He will use you mightily as a vessel for His glory. When I confessed and gave up the things God asked me to leave, He began to use me in His service. And He will do the same for you.

Dear young readers, If God could transform Mani Abraham, a young man who once desired to be a rowdy, into a passionate servant of Jesus Christ – He can change you too! No matter what sin or bondage holds you today, surrender your life to Christ just as he did, and you will see the Lord make you a flame of revival for His kingdom!



"He (Cornelius) was a devout man and one who feared God with all his household, gave generously to those in need, and prayed to God continually" — (Acts 10:2).

Cornelius, the Roman centurion, though unaware of who the true God was, still believed that there is indeed one divine being worthy of reverence. Out of this conviction, he lived a life marked by generosity, giving to the poor and the needy. One day, an angel appeared and said to him, "Your prayers and your alms have come up before God as a memorial."

Every act of kindness we do for others reaches the very presence of God. Therefore, we must dedicate ourselves to doing good and practicing generosity.

WHY SHOULD WE DO GOOD? I. IT IS GOD'S COMMAND

"The poor will never cease from the land; therefore, I command you to open your hand wide to your brother, to the poor and needy in your land." — Deuteronomy 15:11

Our Lord is full of compassion and concern for the poor and lowly; that is why He gave this command. The Bible warns that whoever mocks or insults the poor actually reproaches their Maker (Proverbs 17:5). We must never despise those who are simple or struggling, for God Himself cares deeply for them.

2. DOING GOOD IS LENDING TO THE LORD

"He who has pity on the poor lends to the Lord, and He will pay back what he has given." — Proverbs 19:17

When you give to the poor, you are, in fact, giving a loan to the Lord! Many people believe they give to God only when they offer tithes or offerings in church, but the Word says otherwise. Whenever you extend help to a wid-

ow, an orphan, or anyone in distress, you are giving directly to God — and He will surely repay you.

The Lord once spoke to me clearly:

"Just as you set apart a portion for ministry, set apart a portion for the poor."

Since then, both in my personal life and in our Jesus Redeems ministry, I have always divided our offerings into three parts: one for the Lord's work, one for ministers in need, and one for the poor.

Every Christian must learn this discipline — to do good to others — for it is a divine command.

TO WHOM SHOULD WE DO GOOD?

I. To Those Who Deserve It

"Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in the power of your hand to do so" — (Proverbs 3:27)

The Bible doesn't say to do good to everyone indiscriminately; it says to do good to those who truly deserve it.

Once, a man without arms came to me asking for help. He said tearfully, "I have to conduct my daughter's marriage, but I have no money for food for the guests." Surprisingly, I didn't feel led to help him, so I simply took his contact and sent someone to verify. Later, we discovered his story was false — there was no wedding at all! That's why God closed my heart.

God doesn't want us to be deceived; He instructs us to help the truly needy, not those who manipulate.

2. To the Family of Faith

"Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith." — (Galatians 6:10)

Regardless of race or religion, if someone is in need, help them. But especially, extend kindness to fellow believers — those newly saved or struggling in faith.

Years ago, while ministering in a village, I met a poor widow with an unemployed daughter. Her husband had lost his eyesight, and they had no food left — not even a handful of rice. With tears, she said, "Why should we even live? There's no one to help us."

After praying for her, as I was about to leave, the Lord said to me,

"You say I will provide — through whom will I provide if not you? Give to them."

Immediately, I gave whatever money I had to her and said, "Don't be troubled. Just as the Lord provided today, He will continue to provide every day." Months later, she came joyfully saying, "My daughter got a job!" We rejoiced and glorified God.

3. To God's Servants

"Let him who is taught the word share in all good things with him who teaches." — Galatians 6:6

Those who teach us God's Word deserve to share in the blessings we receive. Support pas-



tors, missionaries, and ministers who work tirelessly, often with very little.

Buy a bicycle for one who walks from village to village preaching the Gospel. Offer them a meal, a set of clothes, or any help that strengthens their ministry. When you serve God's servants as the widow of Zarephath served Elijah, you will see how abundantly God blesses you.

Jesus said, "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it for Me." — (Matthew 25:40)

HOW SHOULD WE DO GOOD?

Do not borrow money to do good. Instead, give from what you already have.

Notice those around you — in your church, school, or community — who are struggling and offer practical help.

If a classmate cannot afford books or fees, help them.

If you meet poor people on the streets, help them find work or provide for their needs.


When you do this, God will pour out His blessings upon you abundantly.

Conclusion

Doing good is not optional; it is the heartbeat of a true believer.

When we bless others, heaven takes notice.

Let us live as Cornelius did — with prayerful hearts, generous hands, and a life that continually rises before God as a memorial of love and compassion.

I Am a Prayer Warrior

Over the past eleven months, we have reflected on many types of prayer-each one with its own unique purpose and divine significance. Now that we have reached the final month of this year, even if we were to thank

the Lord a million times for His goodness throughout these twelve months, it still wouldn't be enough. This month, as we meditate on the Prayer of Thanksgiving, let us consider a few essential truths.



What is a Prayer of Thanksgiving?

As they went, all ten were healed. Yet only one man—a Samaritan—returned to thank Jesus, falling at His feet and praising God with a loud voice. Then Jesus

asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" And He said to the man, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well." (Luke 17:17–19)

In those days, lepers were cast out of homes and communities. There was no cure, and only a priest could certify their healing before they could return home. Imagine their joy when Jesus healed them! Yet, nine of them went their way, forgetting to thank the very One who had given them new life. Perhaps they thought, "Jesus told us to go, so let's just obey." Gratitude never crossed their minds.

How often have we cried out to God in desperation — "Lord, please help me!"—and once He answered, drifted away, forgetting His mercy?

If so, remember this: "It is by the Lord's pure grace that we stand and are not consumed." We are alive today only because of His mercy.




Why Gratitude Matters

THE TABERNACLE – GOD DWELLING AMONG HIS PEOPLE

The Tabernacle (Hebrew: Mishkan, meaning "dwelling place") was a temporary structure, representing God's desire to dwell among His people. Just as human beings live together under one roof, God too longed to live among the Israelites. He didn't wait for them to reach the Promised Land or build a temple before being with them. From the moment He delivered them out of Egypt, He chose to dwell in their midst — right there in the wilderness. In the same way, God doesn't wait for us to reach heaven to dwell with us. He longs to live among us, even now, here on earth.

THE SINGLE ENTRANCE – CHRIST THE ONLY WAY

The Tabernacle had only one entrance. Likewise, there is only one way to heaven — Jesus Christ. "I am the way, the truth, and the life." (John 14:6) "I am the door; whoever enters through Me will be saved." (John 10:9) The entrance to the Tabernacle faced west, opposite the direction of sunrise. Entering meant turning one's back on the sun, symbolically

THE SACRIFICE OF GRACE

Inside the Tabernacle, five main sacrifices were offered:

- 1. The Burnt Offering
- 2. The Grain Offering
- 3. The Peace Offering
- 4. The Sin Offering
- 5. The Guilt Offering

All these sacrifices together pointed to the ultimate Sacrifice of Grace — Jesus Christ, who, out of His deep love, offered Himself for the remission of our sins. "This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins." (1 John 4:10)

GOD PROVIDES IN ABUNDANCE

"The people had brought more than enough for doing the work the Lord commanded to be done." (Exodus 36:7) The materials brought for constructing the Tabernacle were not only sufficient but more than enough! When God commands us to do something, He also provides abundantly for it. If we build our studies, careers, businesses, ministries,

families, and future according to His Word, we will never lack anything.

FOLLOWING THE DIVINE PATTERN

The Tabernacle was built exactly according to the pattern shown by God. If Moses had received the blueprint when he was forty years old — a time when he was filled with Egyptian wisdom — he might have designed it in his own way, inspired by the grandeur of Egypt's pyramids and architecture. But Moses did not rely on his knowledge or creativity. He built it precisely as God commanded.

Likewise, we must not twist or adjust the Word of God to suit our preferences. God's instructions must be followed as He said — not as we wish.

BEZALEL – FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT OF WISDOM

"I have filled him with the Spirit of God, with wisdom, with understanding, with knowledge, and with all kinds of skills — to make artistic designs for work in gold, silver, and


bronze." (Exodus 31:5) Bezalel's name means "In the shadow of God." He was filled with divine wisdom and creativity to design and craft the elements of the Tabernacle. When we live under the shadow of the Almighty, He too will fill us with wisdom, skill, and purpose — using us mightily for His glory.

THE CALL TO THE WISE-HEARTED

"Then Moses called Bezalel and Oholiab, and every skilled person to whom the Lord had given ability and who was willing to come and do the work." (Exodus 36:2)

To build the Tabernacle, God raised up wise-hearted people — those who were not only skilled but also willing and stirred by the Spirit. Today, in these last days, God is again looking for such wise-hearted people — to build His Kingdom, to prepare the nations for His coming, and to spread the fire of revival everywhere. Are you ready to be one of them?

A Missionary Who Feared Nothing for Christ!

Last month, we read about the missionary work of Rev. Alexander Duff. This month, let us look at the life of another missionary who fearlessly served the Lord - a man who stood boldly among brutal cannibals on a dangerous island, surrounded by tribes armed with deadly weapons. With love and compassion, he offered himself for the sake of the Gospel, unafraid even to lose his life for Christ.

Early Life

John G. Paton was born in 1824 in Scotland. As a child, his home had a small room called the "Holy Place." His father would go into that room three times a day to pray. The sight of his father's prayer life deeply impacted young John, stirring in him a desire to know Christ personally and to serve Him as a missionary.

John pursued theological studies at a seminary in Glasgow while working as a teacher in a local school. He also joined the Glasgow City Mission, an organization serving the poor and downtrodden. For ten long years, he toiled in this mission before seeing visible fruits of his labour. Many drunkards, idle men, and God-mockers were led to Christ through his ministry. Despite his heavy workload, he continued his theological education faithfully.

The Call to Dangerous Lands

When no one was willing to go to the perishing tribes to share the Gospel, John felt a divine call: "You rise and dedicate yourself to this mission." Obeying this call, at the age of 34 (in 1858), John and his wife set sail for the New Hebrides Islands. After a long voyage, they reached Tanna, an island inhabited by savage cannibals - a place full of danger but desperately in need of the Gospel.

John resolved first to learn their language, translate the Bible, and teach them to read it. But things did not unfold as he expected. Within a short time, his wife died of malaria, and two weeks later, their infant son also passed away. Yet John did not lose heart. He believed that God had sent him there for a purpose and continued the mission, though he stood alone — a widower and a grieving father in a land of hostility.

Facing Persecution

The islanders worshiped evil spirits and the souls of their ancestors. They had no understanding of natural death. Whenever someone died, they blamed John saying, "Your God caused this death, so we will kill you!"

The sorcerers of the land feared that if the people accepted the Gospel, their own power and influence would vanish. Hence, whenever calamities struck, they stirred the people to accuse the missionaries, claiming, "These

white men have angered the gods!" and sought to kill them.

ministry John's was filled with danger, persecution, and threats. Yet, even amid constant fear and hardship, he pressed on for four years. Eventually, he returned to Scotland for a short rest. There, he preached in many churches, sharing about the needs of his mission

field. His passionate testimony inspired four young men to dedicate their lives as missionaries to the same islands.

The Aniwa Mission

In January 1865, John moved to the nearby island of Aniwa. There too, dangers awaited him, but his faith stood firm. He learned the Aniwa language and used the same methods he had practiced in Tanna - translating the Scriptures, teaching literacy, and preaching Christ.


Over time, many islanders accepted Jesus. Yet opposition persisted — from nature and from men. Since the island lacked clean water for drinking or washing, John decided to dig a well. The people mocked him saying, "Water

comes only from the sky through rain. This man is mad to dig the earth for it!"

But John continued digging, full of faith and prayer. One day, the ground grew damp — a sign that water was near. He gathered the villagers around and drew water from the pit. Amazed, they cried, "How wonderful! Rain is coming from under the ground!"

When they asked how this was possible, John said, "We had no water, so I prayed to God, and He gave it to us." The island chief, aston-

> ished, shouted, "Jehovah is the true God!" That well achieved what years of sermons could not — it turned the hearts of the people toward the Living God. Many believed in lesus and were baptized. During dry seasons, the people survived by drink-



In 1899, John Paton published the New Testament in the Aniwa language. Re-

alizing the need for a place of worship, the new believers built a church together joyfully. He also compiled and printed a hymn book in their language and established two orphan homes. Many of those orphans later became teachers and Gospel workers.

No matter how many trials came his way, John held on to his unshakable faith: "The One who called me is faithful. His hand will guide me, and He will never forsake me." Because of his tireless service, countless people continue to worship Christ even today. Let us, too, dedicate ourselves wholly to Jesus and His Kingdom, with the same passion, courage, and surrender that filled the life of John G. Paton, the fearless missionary of the islands!



Ekta Bhyan was born in 1985 in the state of Haryana, India. Like every other child, she was active in both academics and sports, full of enthusiasm and determination. But in 2003, when she was just 17 years old, a tragic bus accident changed her life forever. She suffered severe spinal cord injuries that left her paralyzed from the waist down. Doctors said she would never walk again and would have to spend the rest of her life in a wheelchair. What could have become the end of her dreams became, instead, the turning point of her life. Ekta refused to sink into despair or self-pity. Instead, she embraced a new beginning with hope and joy, determined to make her life meaningful again.

Rising Beyond Limitations

She completed her Master's degree in English and, in 2011, cleared the prestigious Haryana Civil Services Examination. She now serves as an Assistant Director in the State Department of Employment. In 2014, she turned her eyes toward sports once again — this time as a para-athlete. She began training in club throw and discus throw events, sports that required immense discipline and perseverance. Her hard work soon bore fruit. In 2016, at the IPC Grand Prix held in Berlin, she won a silver medal in the club throw category. Two years later, at the 2018 Asian Para Games

held in Jakarta, she brought glory to India by winning the gold medal. Continuing her success, in 2025, at the World Para Athletics Championships held in New Delhi, she once again secured a silver medal in the club throw event — her ninth international medal!

In recognition of her incredible spirit and achievements, she was honoured in 2018 with the National Award for Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities under the category "Differently-abled Athlete of the Year."

While reflecting on this miracle, I began to





Alcohol Consumption

In Tamil Nadu, there are 4,829 TASMAC liquor shops and about 3,240 bars attached to these outlets.

Each day, liquor sales generate ₹120–130 crores, which rises to ₹140–150 crores on weekends.

During festive seasons, the figures soar by another 15%. Last year, liquor sales during Diwali touched ₹438 crores. This year, the government set a target of ₹600 crores, yet the sales exceeded expectations, reaching an astonishing ₹789.85 crores. Specifically, on October 18, 2025, sales recorded ₹230.06 crores; on October 19, ₹293.73 crores; and on Diwali day, ₹266.06 crores. In India, among people above 15 years of age, 18.7% of men and 1.3% of women consume alcohol.

Prayer Points

- I. Pray for the complete closure of liquor shops across Tamil Nadu.
- 2. Pray that leaders and authorities will understand that income through liquor brings a curse, not a blessing.
- 3. Pray that the destruction of families and relationships caused by alcohol addiction will be stopped.
- 4. Pray for protection from accidents and deaths resulting from alcohol consumption.

Climate Change and Seasonal Diseases

Due to climate change, seasonal fevers have become common in various parts of the state. Typically, these illnesses spread widely during October and November, but last year, they persisted from August until April. This year too, fevers and respiratory infections have been spreading rapidly. Influenza has affected people across all age groups, while dengue fever is on the rise, causing public fear and concern. According to the Health Department, 60 –70 people are being treated for dengue every day. So far this year, over 14,000 cases have been reported, and 7 people have lost their lives.

Prayer Points

- I. Pray for God's divine protection over everyone against diseases caused by seasonal changes.
- 2. Pray that the government will take preventive measures to stop the spread of fever and respiratory illnesses.
- 3. Pray for the complete healing of all those affected by dengue fever and for divine protection during the rainy season.
- 4. Pray that the spread of infections caused by climate change will be restrained and that people will be safeguarded from contagious diseases.

Rising Food Prices

India, now the fifth-largest economy in the world, is facing a severe challenge — the sharp rise in food prices, making healthy meals unaffordable for many families. According to surveys conducted in 2024, Mumbai alone has seen a 65% increase in food prices over the last five years.

The World Bank released a shocking report stating that:

- In Russia, 93% of people cannot afford healthy food.
- In Pakistan, 83% face the same issue.
- In India, 74% of the population lacks access to nutritious food.

Prayer Points

- I. Pray that the food shortage caused by floods and the destruction of crops in several states will be reversed.
- 2. Pray for abundant rainfall and blessings upon southern states suffering from drought, so that agriculture may flourish again.
- 3. Pray that God will send rain in due season and wipe away the tears of the farmers.
- 4. Pray that India's economy will prosper and that inflation and food prices will come down.

Adulterated and Fake Medicines

The World Health Organization has reported that fake and substandard medicines are being sold in India by several unauthorized companies. Recently, the death of 20 children in Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan due to adulterated cough syrup shocked the Investigations confirmed that the syrup — produced by Kancheepuram-based Srisan Pharma under the brand name Coldrip — contained diethylene glycol, a deadly toxin. Over the past six years, more than 120 children have died due to similar adulterated syrups. Cough syrups usually include solvents like propylene glycol, glycerin, and sorbitol to dissolve ingredients. However, in these cases, the manufacturers mistakenly or negligently used industrial-grade diethylene glycol, a toxic chemical that causes severe kidney damage, nervous system failure, and death. India earns nearly \$30 billion (₹3,000 crores) annually through pharmaceutical exports, but such tragedies reveal the dark side of negligence in medicine production.

Prayer Points

- I. Pray that fake medicine production and distribution will be strictly monitored and brought to justice.
- 2. Pray that counterfeit medicines will be quickly identified and destroyed before harming anyone.
- 3. Pray that the licenses of companies involved in manufacturing adulterated medicines will be revoked, and that those responsible will repent of their wrongdoing.
- 4. Pray that no more lives will be lost due to contaminated or substandard drugs.

Even my inner voice tells me that such a relationship isn't wrong.





UPI Transactions in India!



In a historic financial milestone, India has achieved an unprecedented record in UPI (Unified Payments Interface) transactions, with a total transfer value of ₹27.28 lakh crore in just one month.

According to the latest report released by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), during October, the total number of UPI transactions reached 2,070 crore, marking a 3.6% increase compared to September's figures. This phenomenal growth, never seen before in India's digital payment history, is attributed to GST reforms and the festive season boost, which significantly increased the flow of digital money through UPI.

On average, India recorded ₹66.8 crore UPI transactions every day, showcasing the massive adoption of cashless payments across the nation.

Over 1 Lakh Employees Dismissed — Amazon, Microsoft, Intel Workers Fearful
