




Be diligent in exhortation and teaching.


Watch your life and your doctrine carefully.

# Victory Beyond Vision



Today, we're going to look at the inspiring journey of **Michael Vinciya**, a young girl from a small village in Thoothukudi district – born with visual impairment, struck by a mysterious illness during her 10th grade; yet rising above every limitation to become **School First in Grades 10, 11, and 12**, and now pursuing her college education with confidence and courage.

## TELL US ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CHILDHOOD...

I come from Vembadu village in Thoothukudi district. I'm currently studying in my first year of college. I was born with visual impairment.

Though I was born into a Christian family, for many years I lived a life without truly knowing Christ.

It was only when I joined a special school for visually challenged students (from Grades 9 to 12) that I slowly began to learn about Jesus and the miracles He performed.



Even though I grew up in a Christian family, was only after joining the special school that truly began to understand who Jesus is. Before that, I simply believed Jesus was the God my family worshipped, and that the Bible was our holy book. That was it. But when my teachers began sharing messages about Jesus – when I started listening to sermons in church, hearing testimonies, understanding Scripture – something awakened inside me. It sparked curiosity. It stirred wonder.

For the first time, faith felt real.

## WHAT WAS YOUR CHURCH EXPERIENCE LIKE?

Honestly? I didn't like going to church. I was embarrassed to carry a Bible. I worried other children might mock me. But my mother would insist I take it along. So I would go – not out of passion, but out of duty.

Even when verses were read, I would simply open the Bible and leave it there. I wouldn't really read. I wouldn't truly listen. I was present physically – but absent spiritually.

## THEN HOW DID YOU TRULY COME TO KNOW JESUS?

After joining the special school, I began understanding that the Bible isn't just a book of paper – every word in it is God's living message to us. I learned that Jesus was born on this earth for us, carried our sins and curses upon Himself, died on the cross, defeated Satan, broke the chains of death, and rose again on the third day. And that He is alive – even today. That realization overwhelmed me. It felt unbelievable – yet deeply powerful.

## WHAT CHANGES FOLLOWED IN YOUR LIFE?

While studying in 10th grade, suddenly I began experiencing severe fainting spells. Without warning, I would collapse. My body would go cold. I would remain unconscious for two or three days. Doctors examined me repeatedly – scans, tests, consultations. Every report said the same thing: "There is no problem." Yet the fainting never stopped.

I was prescribed eight tablets a day. For an entire year, I consumed medicines endlessly. Side effects increased. My studies suffered. But the condition remained. My parents cried and prayed for me daily.

## WHEN DID THINGS CHANGE? WERE YOU ABLE TO WRITE YOUR EXAMS?

One month before my 10th public exams, I fainted again.



Fear gripped me. I didn't know what I had studied. I didn't know how prepared I was. What if I fainted during the exam? I stopped going to school. One day, while scrolling on my phone at home, I came across videos from an **Achievers Meeting** – students who had succeeded despite sickness sharing their testimonies.

Hope was reborn in me.

That night, I knelt down to pray. My heart was heavy. I didn't know how to pray. I simply cried. Finally, I whispered three things: "I am sorry, Jesus. I am scared. Please help me." And I slept.

The next morning, something had shifted. My heart felt light. Courage rose within me. Confidence returned. I woke up early, read my Bible, prayed over every textbook by placing my hands on them, and rushed to school. "Jesus, study with me. Be with me. Write the exam with me," I prayed. When the results were announced – I scored **478 out of 500**. I became **School First**. It was pure grace.

## DID YOU CONTINUE EXCELLING AFTER THAT?

In 11th grade, things were going well initially. But slowly, my spiritual discipline weakened. I postponed prayer. I delayed reading the Bible. "Tomorrow," I would say. Eventually, tomorrow never came.

Soon, the fainting returned – this time more severe. I was hospitalized frequently.





On January 26, 2024, while the Achievers Meeting was happening, I was in the hospital.

When my schoolmates shared what happened at the meeting, I realized my mistake. With tears, I returned to Jesus. "Forgive me. I will not drift away again. Make me Your beloved daughter. My parents are hurting because of me. Heal me. Next year, I will testify at the Achievers Meeting." Jesus forgave me. He restored me.

In 11th grade, I scored **538 out of 600**, once again becoming School First.

And the following January 26, I stood on that stage and shared my testimony – just as I had prayed.

### WHAT ABOUT 12TH GRADE?

In 12th grade, I wrote my exams without any health issues and scored **547 out of 600**, once again securing first place in my school. Today, I am pursuing higher education in a good college. From that day to now, I have had no health issues. The God




who forgave my sins, healed my sickness, lifted me from weakness, and crowned me with excellence. He continues to give me grace to remain faithful. To God alone be all the glory!

**Dear young people, this is not just a story of academic success. It's a story of weakness turned into strength. Fear transformed into faith. Sickness crowned with victory.**

**Because when God steps in, pressure becomes purpose, pain becomes preparation, and trials become testimonies!**





# Bible Exploration

Hello friends!

Last month, we explored the background of Genesis. We believe it strengthened your Bible Reading Journey and helped you see the bigger picture of God's story. Ready to dive deeper this month?

Let's unpack the next four powerful books of the Bible and discover what they reveal about God — and about us.

## ► Exodus – From Slavery to Salvation

Exodus is the story of a God who refuses to ignore oppression. After 400 years of slavery, God raises up Moses as a deliverer. Plagues strike Egypt. Pharaoh's heart hardens. And then — the Red Sea parts. What looked impossible becomes a highway of freedom.

Exodus reminds us that no bondage is too strong when God steps in.

### ► Law and Covenant (Exodus 19–20)

The Ten Commandments were not given as a condition for love. God did not say, "Obey first, then I will love you." He said, "I have already delivered you — now live differently."

Obedience is not a way to earn salvation. It is a response to it.

### ► Leviticus – Worship and Holiness

Leviticus may feel intense to read, but its message is crystal clear:

1. The God we worship is holy.
2. Sin has consequences — but forgiveness is possible.
3. Sacrifices created a way for broken people to approach a holy God.

Every offering reminded Israel that grace was necessary and restoration was available. Holiness was not about restriction; it was about relationship.

### ► Numbers – Lessons from the Wilderness

The Israelites doubted the very God who rescued them. They complained. They rebelled. They

feared their enemies. A journey that could have taken 14 days (around 320 km) stretched into 40 years. Why? Because unbelief delays destiny.

The wilderness was not just a place — it was a consequence.

## ► Deuteronomy – Remember Who You Are

Before entering the Promised Land, Moses reminds the people of three powerful truths:


1. Never forget God.
2. Never turn away from Him.
3. Choose life. Choose holiness.

Memory shapes destiny. When we forget who saved us, we forget who we are.

## Remember This

- God sees injustice and responds.
- Salvation is received freely by grace — but growth in it is a lifelong journey.
- God's commands are not chains; they are protection.
- Complaining and constant doubt can trap us in wilderness seasons.
- Humility before God is the beginning of transformation.
- If we desire salvation but resist being shaped, we cannot reach the fullness of His promise.

# Don't be Negligent

**In today's fast-paced world, young people are constantly navigating pressure from every side—academics, careers, ministry, social media, technology... the list never ends. Staying alert isn't optional anymore; it's essential.**

But when we slip into a mindset of “I'll do it tomorrow” or “I don't have time right now”, we quietly push away the very success we're praying for. Negligence isn't just laziness. It's distraction. It's irresponsibility. It's ignoring your future.

When you waste time instead of focusing on your studies, you're not just losing marks—you're delaying your destiny. Look at people who've truly succeeded in life. They didn't win because life was easy. They faced failure. They faced criticism. They faced exhaustion. But they didn't quit. They used their time wisely, seized their opportunities boldly, and climbed to heights others only dreamed of.

Take MS Dhoni, for example. The world recognizes him as one of India's finest captains. Yet he came from a simple background and worked as a railway ticket collector. He could

The Bible says, “A sluggard’s appetite is never filled” (Proverbs 19:15). When we live negligently, opportunities slip through our fingers. Especially in our youth, this is the season to stay spiritually and practically alert—to receive the blessings God has prepared.

Look at Samson. Chosen and anointed by God to lead Israel, he had incredible strength and a powerful calling. But he ignored God’s warnings. His negligence led him into sin, and he lost everything—even his eyesight. The one meant to lead became a spectacle for his enemies. Anointing was there. Calling was there. But negligence destroyed it.

Now look at Joseph. Betrayed by his brothers. Sold as a slave. Falsely accused. Imprisoned. Yet he never became negligent with his faith or responsibilities. Even in pain, he stayed disciplined. Even in disappointment, he stayed loyal to God. That consistency elevated him from a slave to the Prime Minister of Egypt. What others meant for evil, God turned into elevation—because Joseph stayed faithful.

**Young people, hear this: If you become negligent in prayer, faith, holiness, you risk delaying God’s plan for your life. But if you stay steady—through prayer, patience, and perseverance—your direction will change. Your story will change.**

**No matter what trials you’re facing right now, don’t panic. Don’t drift. Don’t disengage.**

**Stay sharp. Stay disciplined. Stay spiritually awake...!**

**When God’s appointed time comes, He will lift you up.**

**So don’t live negligent. Live conscious. Live committed. Live ready...!**




# You can Do it!!



Brazil is known for producing some of the most celebrated football players in the world. In FIFA football, those who rise to excellence become global icons. Among them was a young Brazilian named Kaka (Ricardo Izecson dos Santos Leite). He carried a burning dream — to play at the highest level and become one of the best in the world.



While training passionately to achieve that dream, tragedy struck. In the year 2000, he slipped into a swimming pool, suffered a severe spinal fracture, and was left bedridden. Doc-

tors told him bluntly, "Even walking again will be difficult. Playing football is impossible." For a young man whose heart beat for the game, those words were devastating. His dream seemed shattered.

Yet something inside him refused to die. Driven by determination and strengthened by faith, he underwent intense treatment and rehabilitation. Within a year, he was back on the field. The world watched in disbelief. He trained relentlessly. In 2007, he competed on the global FIFA stage and won the Best Player Award. When asked how he achieved such a comeback, his response was simple yet powerful: "Jesus Christ gives us more than what we ask for." After his accident, his faith in Jesus had grown stronger than ever.


Let me tell you how the Lord will strengthen you and turn you into an achiever:




## He Will Restore Your Memory!


Hello friends! How are you all doing? Warm greetings to you in the mighty name of Jesus Christ!

Here's a powerful truth — anything produced under pressure becomes valuable.

Let's talk about something simple yet profound: olive oil.

**Alright, come on — Let's dive in. Do you know How Olive oil is made?**



Sounds like a long process, right?

For olive oil to exist, the olives must be washed, crushed, broken, pressed.  
It's not a gentle journey – it's painful. But do you know where that purified  
oil is used?

There's a powerful biblical instruction:

"Command the Israelites to bring you clear oil of pressed  
olives for the light so that the lamps may be kept burning  
continually... from evening till morning before the Lord."  
(Exodus 27:20-21)

Now do you see, friends, why the olives had to go through  
that process?

That crushed, pressed, purified oil was needed to keep the  
lamp burning continually in the presence of the Lord.

If a simple olive has to endure such a process to shine as light in God's dwelling, how much more us — chosen to burn brightly in His presence?

Yes, the process is intense. Yes, it feels crushing. But pressure is not meant to drown you – it is meant to prepare you.

Just as olives are washed before being used, God cleanses us before He uses us.

Just as olives are crushed and pressed, the Lord may allow seasons that break, stretch, and refine us.

And just as the extracted liquid sits in darkness until the oil rises to the top, God sometimes allows us to walk through dark seasons – until the anointing of the Holy Spirit rises within us. But remember – darkness is never permanent.

**In the end, what emerges is something pure and powerful. Like olive oil rising to the surface, Christ's power will rise within us.**


**We will begin to carry His fragrance. We will flow like a river of life.**

# Science and the Bible

*Hi friends,*

Hope you're all doing great! Warm greetings to you in the precious name of our Lord Jesus Christ! I'm so excited to meet you again in this series titled "Science and the Bible."

Have you ever looked at something around you and wondered, "Why does this happen?" Why is the ocean blue? Why can birds fly? We're naturally curious. We want to know the reason behind the reality. And here's something amazing – behind everything happening around us, there are scientific truths at work. And when we pause to think about them deeply, they don't just reveal science... they point us back to the Creator.

Alright friends, this month let's explore something simple yet powerful: Floating and Sinking.

Wait – what are you thinking? Stay with me. You'll see where this is going.

## A Simple Experiment

Take a bucket full of water. Drop in a light object. Then drop in a heavy object. What happens?

The lighter object floats. The heavier object sinks. That's what we call floating and sinking.

But why does this happen? What's the scientific explanation behind it?

Here's the truth: If an object has less density than water, it floats. If it has greater density than water, it sinks.

But here's an even more interesting fact. The real reason objects float is because of an upward force created in the water – called upthrust or buoyant force. This invisible force pushes objects upward, resisting gravity. If this upward force is stronger than the object's weight, the object floats. If gravity overpowers it, the object sinks. Wow, isn't that incredible? Even though we cannot see it, God has designed water with this hidden force that prevents things from sinking.



## But Why Are We Talking About This?

Because this isn't just physics. It's life.

Sometimes, we may feel like light and fragile objects. A strong wind can easily push a light object away, while a heavy object stands firm. But when it comes to water, everything changes.

Likewise, if our hearts are filled with the heavy weight of sin, worldly desires, fear, anxiety, and worries, we begin to sink in the struggles of life.

And let's be honest – haven't we all felt like we were drowning at some point?

Drowning in temptation. Drowning in pressure. Drowning in disappointment.

But just like the upward force in water keeps objects afloat, the Holy Spirit lifts us up.

As Romans 8:26 says, "The Spirit helps us in our weakness." The Holy Spirit becomes that invisible upward force in our lives – preventing us from sinking into sin, despair, and defeat. Not only does He keep us afloat, but He empowers us to overcome.



**Dear young people, are you feeling like you keep falling in life? Like you want to overcome sin, but you just can't?**

**Like when hardships come, you lose strength and even prayer feels impossible? Don't panic.**

**Ask the Holy Spirit for help. He will not allow you to sink. He will lift you. He will strengthen you. He will carry you through. Because in this battle called life, you were never meant to fight gravity alone.**

**Amen!**

# THE WEARY

## Sisera, Barak



Barak led his 10,000 warriors down from Mount Tabor and struck Sisera's army with fierce force. The battle turned decisive. Sisera abandoned his chariot and fled on foot while Barak pursued and destroyed his entire army as far as Harosheth.

Not a single soldier survived.

Yet Sisera himself escaped and hid inside Jael's tent. Exhausted and drained, he fell into a deep sleep. In that vulnerable moment, Jael drove a tent peg through his temple, and Sisera died (Judges 4).

Exhaustion cost him his life.

## Elijah

Elijah — the prophet who shook nations on Mount Carmel — called down fire from heaven and silenced false prophets. Yet when Queen Jezebel threatened to kill him, fear overwhelmed him. He ran for his life.

In the wilderness, under a broom tree, he sat down and prayed to die: "Enough, Lord. Take my life." Then he lay down and slept — emotionally drained and spiritually crushed.

But God wasn't done with him.



There were still kings to anoint — Hazael over Aram, Jehu over Israel. There was still a mission ahead.

Instead of rebuking him, God restored him. He removed his exhaustion and reminded him: "The journey is too great for you." Strengthened by divine grace, Elijah rose again (1 Kings 19:1–16).

# THE RELENTLESS

## Caleb



When Moses sent twelve spies into Canaan, Caleb was one of them.

Ten returned terrified, saying, “The people there are giants.”

But Caleb — alongside Joshua — stood fearless.

“The land is good. With God’s help, we can take it.”

Because of his unwavering faith, Caleb entered the Promised Land forty years later.

At 85 years old, when the land was being divided, Caleb didn’t ask for comfort. He didn’t request ease. He asked for Hebron — the most difficult mountain region, where giants lived.

At eighty-five, he declared boldly:

“I am just as strong today as I was at forty. Give me this mountain!” And he conquered it.

Age didn’t weaken his faith. Time didn’t dilute his fire. He followed God wholeheartedly (Numbers 13–14).

## Paul

The Apostle Paul was a spiritual powerhouse. After encountering Christ, he became unstoppable in spreading the Gospel. He traveled across nations, planted churches throughout Asia Minor and Europe, wrote letters that now form more than thirteen books of the New Testament, and endured intense persecution – all for Christ.

Shipwrecks. Imprisonments. Beatings. Opposition. Yet he pressed on.



Paul even worked as a tentmaker to support himself, never seeing it as a burden, but as a platform to continue his mission. He remained constant in prayer, passionate in encouragement, and relentless in ministry. He didn’t slow down. He didn’t settle. He didn’t surrender.

He didn't just want to work for a company – he wanted to build one.

After deep thought, he made a bold move. He resigned from his secure job and returned to India to pursue entrepreneurship. Many opposed his decision and questioned his risk, but he refused to let others' doubts weaken his vision. In

India, he launched ventures like SearchMyCampus, Flyrr, and Watchkart. Unfortunately, they failed. His breakthrough did not come immediately. Yet, instead of quitting, he treated failure as preparation.

In 2010, he founded Lenskart with a mission to make eye care affordable and accessible to every Indian. At that time, people were hesitant to buy eyewear online. Instead of giving up, he innovated by introducing services like "Try at Home" and "Home Eye Check-up," which built trust and attracted customers. Step by step, the company grew.

Today, Lenskart has thousands of stores across India and abroad, transforming the eyewear industry and impacting millions of lives.

*Friends, Peyush did not achieve his dream in a day or even in a year. His early efforts failed, but he did not give up. That is the difference between those who dream and those who achieve. Success may not come quickly, but it always comes to those who refuse to quit. Keep striving. Work harder. Stay focused. Your effort will never be wasted. Victory may take time, but for the persistent, it is inevitable...!*

History remembers her with a powerful title — "The Angel of the Prisons."*

*So, who was this extraordinary woman?*



Elizabeth Fry was born into a wealthy family in England. As a young woman, she accepted Jesus Christ and dedicated her life to Him. She began her ministry in Norwich, reaching out to the poor and underprivileged, teaching them the Bible, and starting Sunday schools for poor children.

After marriage, she moved to Essex, where she cared for the sick and boldly shared the Gospel. But soon, her calling took a dramatic turn.

In the early 19th century, she learned about the horrifying conditions inside Newgate Prison. Over a hundred women were crammed into tiny cells without sanitation, freezing in unbearable cold, living in filth and despair. No one cared. Society had written them off.

But Elizabeth refused to look away.

She met city officials, raised her voice, and demanded change. Slowly, her efforts began to bear fruit. Prison conditions started improving. Daily morning and evening prayers were introduced. Bible reading became part of their routine. Women were taught sewing skills. Something powerful happened.



Women who once lived in hopelessness began to find dignity. Through sewing, they earned income. Through discipline, they regained self-respect. Through the Word of God, they discovered purpose.

There was another brutal reality in those days. Prisoners from London were transported by ship to Australia. During the long sea voyages, female prisoners remained chained, denied medical care, and after arrival, they continued to live like slaves. When Elizabeth heard this, she ap-

pealed directly to government authorities. Because of her relentless determination, these cruelties were gradually reduced.

What began in Newgate soon influenced prison reforms across the nation. Every time prison ships departed from England, Elizabeth would personally go to the docks. She gifted each prisoner a Bible, along with yarn and needles to knit warm clothing. She didn't just send them off – she sent them with hope. And this wasn't a short-term project. She served faithfully for 25 years.

When she first visited Newgate in 1813, she was heartbroken by the suffering of women prisoners and their children. She provided them with clothes and food. She established a chapel inside the prison and even started a school for their children. She trained them in sewing and knitting so they could sustain themselves with dignity. Above all, she taught them the life-transforming truths of God's Word. Many prisoners, touched by the love of Christ she reflected, repented and turned back to the Lord.

One winter, seeing the body of a homeless boy lying in the snow deeply moved her. She responded by establishing shelters for the homeless to stay safely at night. Her compassion even caught the attention of Queen Victoria, who supported her work with donations. The prison reform principles she pioneered were later adopted across Europe. Her life inspired future missionaries to not only preach the Gospel but also engage in meaningful social service.

At a time when society discouraged women from stepping out boldly, Elizabeth Fry stood firm. What gave her such courage? Her limitless love for the Lord and her unwavering commitment to serve meaningfully.

**Dear young people! It's not about what ministry you do – it's about how you win souls. Just like Elizabeth Fry reached countless souls through prison ministry, let us also prepare ourselves to go after the forgotten souls behind bars. Because revival doesn't always start in churches. Sometimes, it starts in prisons!**


The war between Russia and Ukraine, which began on February 24, 2022, has now crossed


## PRAY FOR STUDENTS' MENTAL HEALTH

Let's talk about how we can detox our souls from something that has slowly taken over our time, focus, and peace.

Yes — we're talking about a Social Media Detox.



### Be Honest...

1. The moment you wake up, is your first thought: "What updates did I miss? Who texted me? Any new notifications?" — and you instantly grab your phone?
2. Do you stay up late scrolling endlessly through Reels and Shorts?
3. Do you keep checking your phone every few minutes just in case a message or notification pops up?

If you're doing even one of these regularly... you might be in the **Danger Zone**.

You don't just need better time management. You need a detox from mobile addiction.

### The Hidden Damage

1. Excessive screen time disrupts your natural sleep cycle.
2. Even while you're asleep, your brain stays overstimulated — leading to mental pressure, distraction, memory issues, and emotional exhaustion. Before you know it, an entire day feels wasted.
3. Connecting with unnecessary influences can pull us toward temptation and trap us in subtle spiritual battles. This often leads to stress and anxiety — what we now call FOMO (Fear of Missing Out).
4. Endless scrolling fuels comparison. We begin measuring our lives against highlight reels — and comparison quietly steals contentment.
5. Maintaining Snapchat streaks has somehow become a badge of pride — but at what cost?

### The Benefits of Detox

- ▲ Medically, reduced screen time lowers anxiety and stress levels.
- ▲ Sharper focus and clarity – improved attention span and better decision-making.
- ▲ Healthier self-esteem – less comparison leads to stronger self-worth.
- ▲ Better sleep and more energetic mornings.

Limiting screen use before bed significantly improves mood and sleep quality.

- ▲ Reduced dopamine spikes – which helps stabilize emotions and prevents mood crashes.
- ▲ Stronger real-life relationships – offline presence builds authentic connections.
- ▲ Most importantly – you begin to hear God’s voice more clearly.
- ▲ “Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you.” (James 4:8)

### How to Do a Social Media Detox

Luke 5:16 says, “But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed.” Detox means disconnecting from the world — to reconnect with God.

2. Replace scrolling time with Bible reading, prayer, devotionals, spiritual books, or worship music.


3. Spend intentional time with your parents. Ask them how they are. Help them. Those small conversations bring joy to them – and peace to you.



## Malala Yousafzai

Mithali Raj isn't just a cricketer - she's a legend. She became the first woman to cross 10,868 runs in Women's International One-Day Internationals. She was also the first Indian woman to score over 2000 runs in T20 Internationals. Honored with the Arjuna Award (2003) and Padma Shri (2015), Mithali's 23-year international career redefined women's cricket in India and set a benchmark that will inspire generations.

## Dr. Tessy Thomas - India's "Missile Woman"

Dr. Tessy Thomas made history as the first woman scientist to head a missile project in India. Fondly known as the "Missile Woman of India," she played a key role as Project Director for the Agni missile program and has been instrumental in India's defense advancements through DRDO.

Her journey is a powerful reminder that science, leadership, and innovation know no gender.

## More than 800 People Reported Missing in Delhi National Human Rights Commission Issues Notice

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has taken suo motu cognizance of reports stating that over 800 people went missing in Delhi last month. Acting on media coverage, the Commission has registered a case and directed the Delhi government to submit a detailed report within two weeks.



According to reports, 807 people were declared missing in the first two weeks of January alone, triggering widespread concern. Of these, 191 are minors and 616 are adults. The Commission stated that police have so far traced 235 individuals, while 572 people remain unaccounted for.

The NHRC has observed that if the contents of the media reports are accurate, they raise serious concerns regarding potential human rights violations. It has therefore instructed the Chief Secretary of Delhi and the Commissioner of Police to provide a comprehensive report on the matter within two weeks.

Further, as per a media report dated February 5, a total of 24,508 missing person complaints were registered in Delhi during 2025. Nearly 60% of those reported missing were women. While 15,421 individuals have been traced by the police, 9,087 cases remain unresolved.

This situation has intensified public concern and drawn national attention to the urgency of addressing missing people's cases in the capital.
