Journey Towards the Goal...

Would you love to hear the inspiring life journey of Brother Felix — the man who cleared the UPSC exam after multiple attempts and is now serving as a Railway Officer? Come, let's hear it from him personally.

Tell us about your childhood and studies.

I was born and brought up in a small village called Melapalayam in Thoothukudi, in a middle-class family. I'm the only son in my family. My parents struggled a lot to admit me into a matriculation school and give me a good education. Honestly, until 9th grade, I wasn't very serious about studies. During that time, I joined a prayer group conducted in school and began praying regularly. My parents also encouraged me to pray and study with dedication. Slowly, things started changing. In 10th standard, I scored centum in two subjects. In 12th standard, I scored centum in Mathematics and became the school topper. After that, I pursued Automobile Engineering — a field I genuinely loved — and graduated with a gold medal. I've always been passionate about cars. From a young age, I dreamed of creating

new designs and inventions in the automobile field, and I focused my studies towards that dream.

So, did your childhood dream come true? Did life move in that direction?

I dreamed of getting into a good company and building my career step by step. I sent my resume to many companies and attended several interviews. But after every interview, one common question came up: "Do you know anyone in the company for recommendation?" I had no recommendation, no influence, and no money. I felt completely lost. During the COVID season, while watching the prayer program "Let's Pray," I cried out to God say-

ing, “Lord, You must recommend me. You lifted me from a tiny village and helped me become a university gold medallist. Then why am I going through so much pain now? What mistake did I make?” That was when God deeply spoke to my heart: “You kept asking Me for everything, but you never asked what My will is for your life.” From that day onward, I began praying seriously every single day. One day, God spoke clearly to me: “I will make you a great officer.” I was shocked. I had studied Engineering. I had zero interest in administration or civil services. But because God spoke it, I slowly received clarity that I should prepare for the Civil Services Examination and pursue IAS or IPS.

Amazing! So did God help you succeed in UPSC?

When I prayed about preparing for UPSC, God confirmed it to me through His servants. Trusting Him fully, I started preparing for the Civil Services Exam. In my very first attempt, I cleared the Prelims and Mains and even reached the Inter-

view stage. I thought, “God has brought me this far beautifully — success is certain now!” But I failed the interview by just 10–15 marks. That failure hurt deeply. I couldn’t understand why God allowed me to come so close to victory and still face disappointment. Since it was my first attempt, the pain was manageable.

So I prepared again. But shockingly, I failed at the interview stage three more times. The hurt became unbearable, especially after hearing humiliating words from relatives and people around me. I became mentally exhausted and broken. Then in 2025, God spoke to me again: “I will make you see joy and gladness. Try one more time.” Honestly, I was terrified of failing again. But because God told me to try once more, I gave it one final attempt. This time, God granted me success. Today, He has lifted me up and given me the position of a Railway Officer.

Wow! From Automobile Engineering to UPSC — how did that shift even happen?

After college, I was doing a very difficult job. Before COVID, the District Collector visited our village for welfare projects. After seeing that, my father asked me, “Why can’t you become a Collector too?” I immediately replied, “That’s not an ordinary thing. It’s



extremely difficult.” But around the same time, God also began speaking to me. Little by little, I started understanding His purpose for my life. I wanted to fulfil my father’s dream too, and that became one of the reasons I started preparing for UPSC.

Preparing for UPSC comes with pressure, failures, and humiliation. How did you overcome all that?

If it had been Engineering-related, I could’ve asked professors or friends for guidance. But nobody in my family had ever studied Civil Services before. I became the first civil servant in my family. There was literally no one to guide me. When I prayed asking God what to do, He helped me through certain people and links that guided me on how to begin. I prepared completely through self-study. The first phase was extremely difficult. During my attempts, some people said hurtful things like, “Not everyone is qualified for this exam.” Those words wounded me deeply. But because God stood with me, I was able to overcome every insult and discouragement.



Finally, what would you like to say to the young people reading this today?

Don’t look at UPSC and think, “It’s impossible.” It’s an exam that searches for talent and perseverance. It took me five years to clear it. Learn from experienced people. Study previous years’ question papers — they will give you tremendous clarity and ideas. Beginners should avoid getting lost in endless videos and links initially.

Start with books and build a strong foundation. Every path towards a dream will be rough. There will be pain, delays, disappointments, and moments where nothing seems to work. But when you give first place to God and allow Him to be your Counselor, He will never abandon you. He will stay with you and bring your dreams to fulfillment.

Dear young people, when you study with a clear goal and purpose, tiredness

loses its power over you. That’s exactly how Brother Felix kept moving forward despite repeated failures. He never stopped pursuing his dream. So don’t be discouraged by failure. Keep moving toward your goal. One day, your journey will become someone else’s inspiration!





Hello friends,

How are you all doing? I am delighted to meet you once again through this series, Science and the Bible.

Today, let us look at something that has the power to protect others.

If you cut a piece of apple and leave it exposed without eating it, what happens? Within just five minutes, it begins to turn brown, doesn't it? But if the sliced apple is immediately placed in salt water, it remains fresh and unchanged in colour.

Why does this happen?

When an apple is cut, the oxygen in the air reacts with its surface, causing it to turn brown. This process is called oxidation. However, when the apple is placed in salt water, the salt forms a protective layer around it. This prevents oxygen from reaching the fruit. In addition, the salt slows down the enzyme responsible for the colour change. As a result, the apple slices remain fresh, bright, and appealing for many hours. Later, they can be rinsed and eaten without any salty taste.

In the same way, dear friends, we too must become like salt—preserving others from being corrupted by the world, and guiding them towards the path of holiness.



Now, why does salt dissolve in water?

Salt is an ionic compound called NaCl, while water is made up of H₂O molecules. When salt is added to water, the bond between sodium (Na) and chloride (Cl) breaks apart. These particles then attach themselves to the water molecules. Sodium is attracted to oxygen, while chloride is surrounded by the hydrogen side of water molecules. This is why salt dissolves completely, leaving only water visible to our eyes.

Likewise, when we give room to the Holy Spirit, the bonds that tie us to the world begin to break. We draw closer to Him, become hidden in Him, and gradually start reflecting His nature. Then He will be glorified through our lives. We will become vessels of honour, just as John the Baptist was mightily used by God.

That is why Jesus declared in Matthew 5:13, "You are the salt of the earth."

Let us therefore become salt—protecting others from the path of destruction, hiding ourselves in the Lord, and revealing Jesus to the world through our lives.

Overflowing Anointing Like Jesus

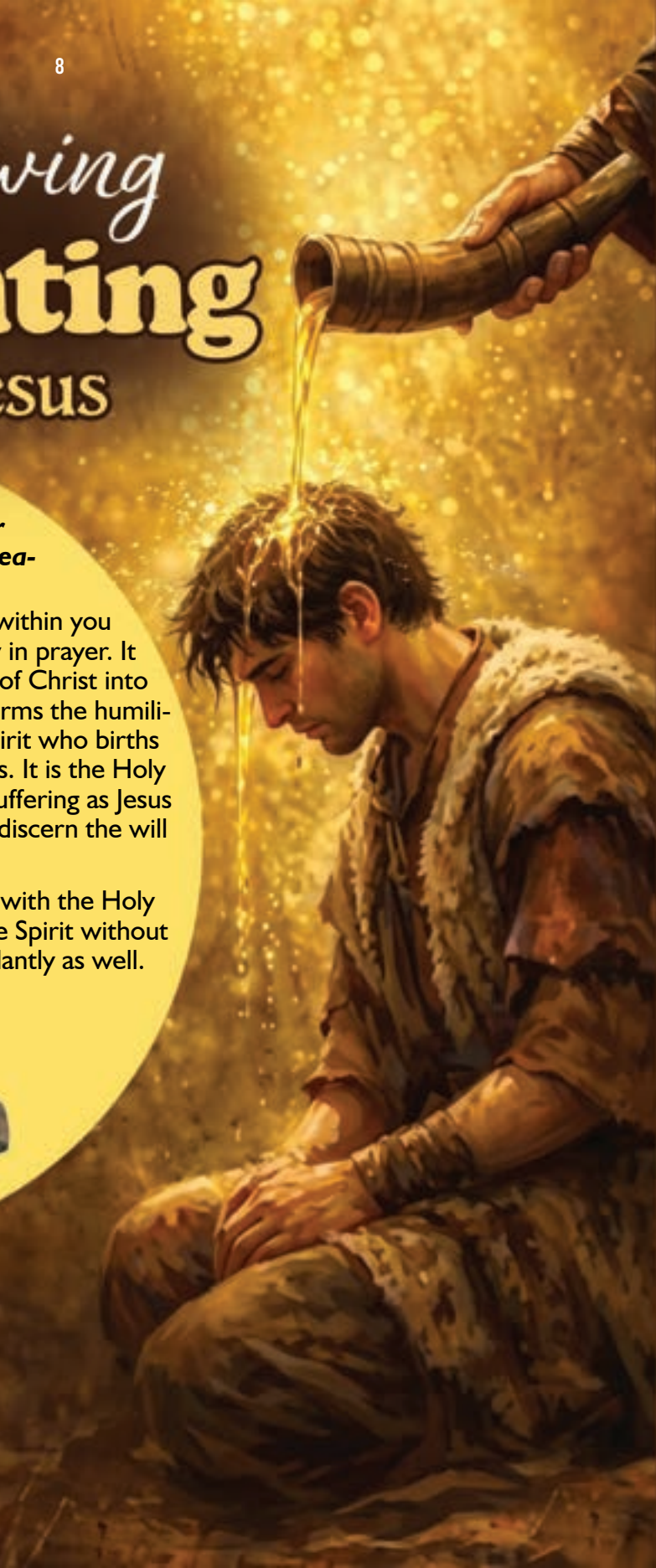
“For He whom God has sent speaks the words of God, for God gives the Spirit without measure.” — John 3:34

Behold the Life of Jesus

FIRST

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Under Pressure

Hey friends! Hope you're all doing well. I'm really happy to meet you again through this series called "Under Pressure."

Every month in this series, we explore how something is broken, shaped, transformed, and refined under pressure — and how that process increases its value, purpose, and beauty.

This month, let's talk about how a clay pot is made.

A lump of clay can never become a beautiful pot overnight. It has to go through intense pressure and a long process of transformation. Let's see what that journey looks like.

HOW A CLAY POT IS MADE?

Pottery is one of Tamil Nadu's oldest traditional crafts, dating back more than 5,000 years.

WHAT'S NEEDED?

Clay from fields or pond banks, pure black or red clay without sand, a potter's wheel, water, carving tools for designs, a kiln, straw, and firewood.

THE PROCESS

The Process: The clay is soaked in water for two days. Stones and sticks are removed, and then it is stomped thoroughly with the feet until it becomes smooth and free from air bubbles — almost like soft dough.

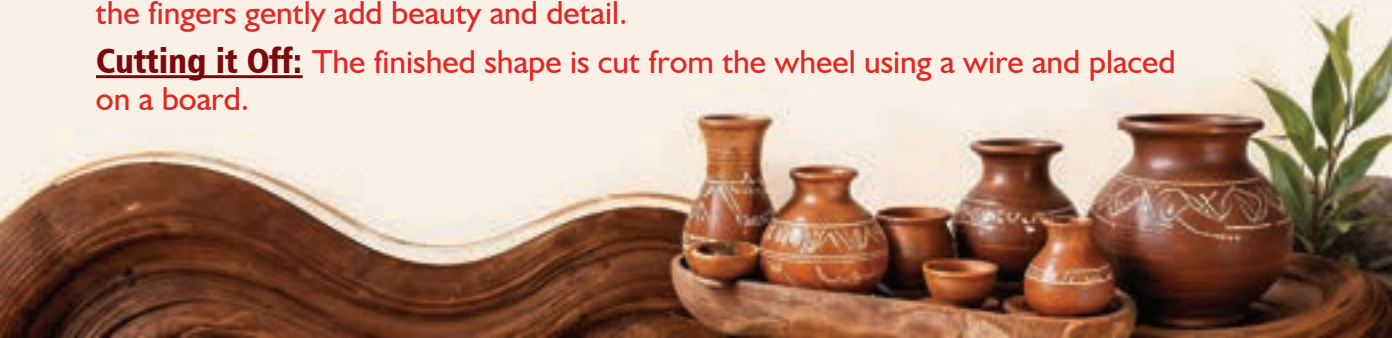
Kneading: The clay is rolled and shaped into a round ball.

Placing it on the Wheel: The clay ball is placed at the centre of the spinning wheel.

Shaping the Pot: The potter presses the clay carefully with his fingers and palms, slowly shaping it into a vessel.

Forming the Neck: The upper edge is folded outward to form the neck of the pot, while the fingers gently add beauty and detail.

Cutting it Off: The finished shape is cut from the wheel using a wire and placed on a board.



Drying: It is left to dry slowly in the shade for two days.

Polishing and Designing: The surface is polished with smooth stones until it shines, and decorative patterns and designs are added.

Firing in the Kiln: Finally, the pots are arranged inside a kiln with straw and firewood and heated for nearly eight hours at temperatures between 800°C and 1000°C. Only after the fire cools down are they taken out.

Clay pots are incredibly beneficial. They keep food naturally cool, allow steam to escape while preserving nutrients, and even add minerals like calcium to water. Their benefits are endless.

See that, friends? Look at the journey of the clay! It became a beautiful and useful vessel only because it endured pressure, shaping, and fire.

For a pot to be made properly, the clay must have the right consistency. If it's too soft, the pot collapses. If it's too hard, it cracks. That's why the potter presses and kneads it with his feet.

In the same way, if we are too weak-hearted, difficult situations can leave us broken and helpless. But if we become hard-hearted, we may depend only on our own understanding and make wrong choices. So God allows seasons of pressure in our lives — just like the potter pressing the clay — to make us strong, steady, and prepared. And the end result is always glorious.

Just as water is essential for clay to be transformed into a pot, the Holy Spirit is essential for our transformation.

Just as polishing stones rub against the pot to make it shine, certain painful situations in life shape us and reveal the character of Christ within us.

And just as the pot becomes strong only after passing through fire, we too become unshakable through the fiery trials we face. That is why God sometimes allows fiery seasons in our lives.

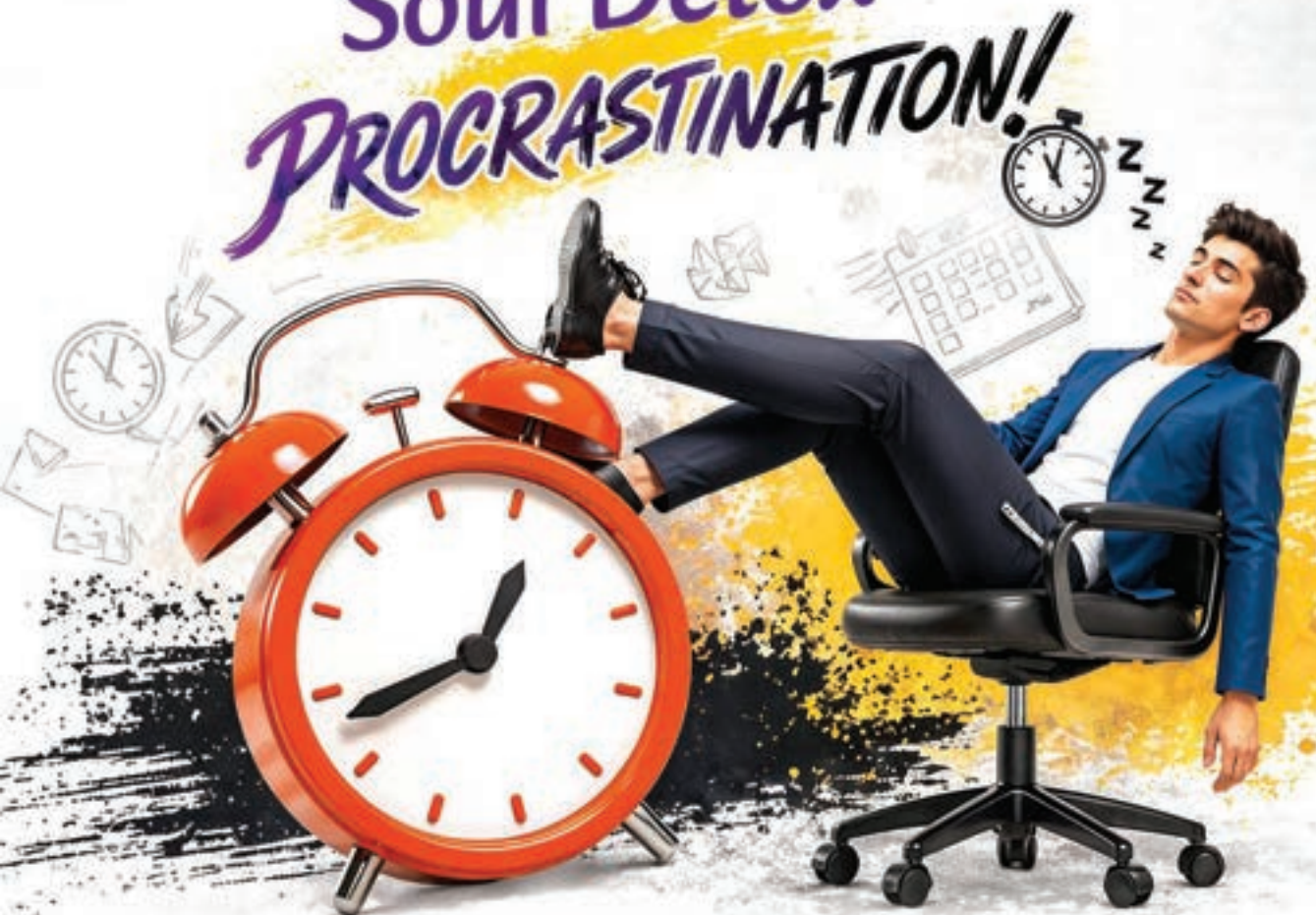
In the end, we become beautiful vessels shaped by God's hands and ready to be used for His purpose.

So friends, let's surrender ourselves like clay in the hands of the Potter.

When you combine these steps with prayer and reading God's Word, He will guide you with wisdom and help you overcome easily.

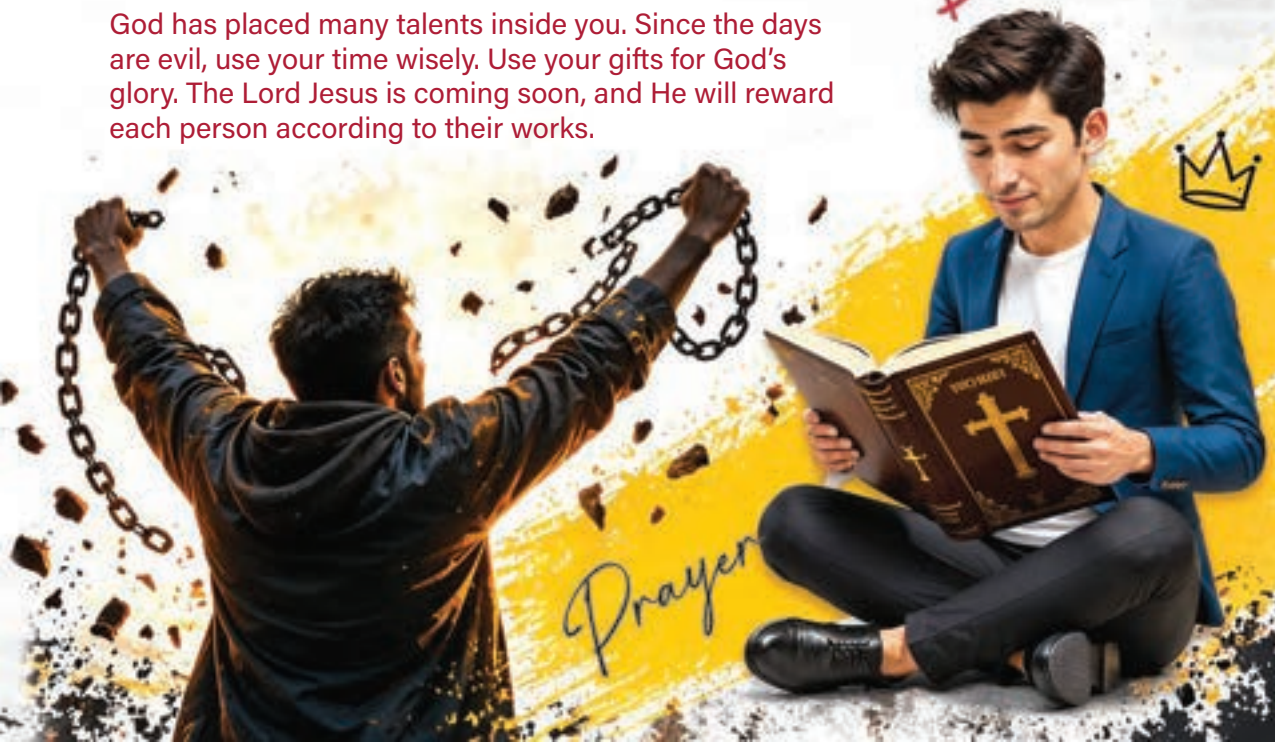

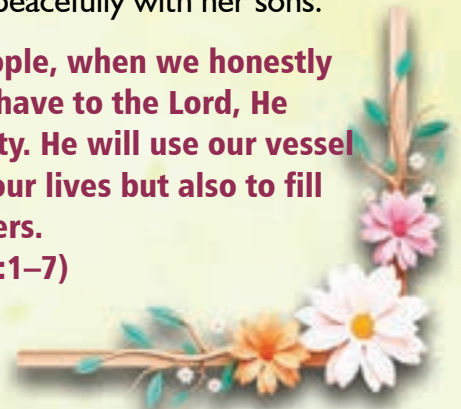
4. The Oil Vessel

Bread for Society

Imagine a bygone era—the 1800s. There were no airplanes. To cross the seas, one had to travel only by ship. Many who left their families for distant lands never returned. It was an age of sacrifice, uncertainty, and unwavering courage.

During that time, a young woman named Ellen Arnold came to British India, to East Bengal (present-day Bangladesh), along with four Australian Baptist women, to serve in the work of God. These five women, all in their twenties, left the comforts of home to become missionaries among people unfamiliar with true worship—especially among women—to make known the living God.

A Divine Calling

Though Ellen was born in England, her family migrated in 1879 to Adelaide, where she worked as a teacher. During those years, a man named Panchanon Biswas from the Faridpur Mission in East Bengal visited South Australia and urged the churches there to send women missionaries to India. His appeal became the confirmation of Ellen's calling.

The Return of a Burning Heart

After receiving basic medical training, Ellen arrived in Faridpur in 1882 and immediately began learning the local language. However, severe illness struck her, forcing her to return to Australia in 1884. Yet the fire within her to serve Christ could not be extinguished. With renewed determination, she returned to Bengal in 1885, accompanied by four more women who joined the mission field. Because of the miracle where Jesus fed the multitude with five loaves and two fish, these five women were affectionately called:

The Five Barley Loaves

They went from house to house, sat among women, conversed with them, prayed with them, taught the Scriptures, and slowly hearts began to open.

A Life Poured Out in Service

Ellen oversaw medical, educational, and construction ministries in Faridpur. In 1886, she moved to Comilla and established a new mission station. Later, she served faithfully in Pabna and Ataikula, continually proclaiming the Gospel, founding schools, and building hospitals for the welfare of the people. The local communities deeply loved her because of her sacrificial service. In 1930, she briefly returned to Australia, but soon came back to Ataikula. There, in 1931, she continued on the path of ministry until her final breath.

Remarkable Facts About Ellen Arnold

- Sent by the South Australian Baptist Missionary Society to Faridpur, India, in October 1882.
- A pioneer who opened the way for women missionaries in India.
- Carried a special burden to bring the Gospel to local women.
- Faced severe hardships and sickness, yet returned again to serve.
- Completed 49 years of missionary service in India.
- Her final three words before death were:

“Tell them to preach”

Bible Exploration

Hello friends! We believe you spent time meditating on the books of Joshua, Judges, and Ruth last month. This month, shall we explore the background of the books of Kings and Chronicles?

These books capture the rise, division, decline, and downfall of Israel's kingdom. Together, they give both a historical and spiritual picture of Israel's journey under monarchy, revealing how obedience or disobedience to God shaped the destiny of the nation.



1 & 2 Kings

The story continues from the final days of King David's reign. Beginning with Solomon, the kingdom reaches its peak in wisdom, wealth, and temple worship. But after Solomon's death, the nation splits into two kingdoms: Israel (the Northern Kingdom) and Judah (the Southern Kingdom).

Most of the kings who followed led the people into idol worship and moral corruption. During this dark season, prophets like Elijah and Elisha arose to call the people back to God. Yet because of continuous sin, Israel eventually fell to Assyria, and later Judah was taken captive by Babylon.



The central message of these books:

Breaking God's covenant leads to judgment.

1 & 2 Chronicles

In contrast, the books of Chronicles were written after the exile and retell much of the same history with a different focus. They mainly highlight Judah, the Temple, and the lineage of David.



Key People

David, Solomon, Rehoboam, Jeroboam, Asa, Jehoshaphat, Hezekiah, Josiah, Elijah, Elisha, Isaiah, Ahab, Jezebel.

The writer of Chronicles emphasizes kings who honored God—such as David, Solomon, Hezekiah, and Josiah—while often minimizing or skipping over the failures strongly highlighted in Kings. Worship, temple restoration, and faithfulness to God’s covenant stand at the center of these books.

Rising Power Demand in Tamil Nadu



As electricity demand continues to grow in Tamil Nadu, the Central Electricity Authority has projected that the state's power requirement may double between 2026–27 and 2036–37.

At present, the average electricity demand in Tamil Nadu stands at 19,000 megawatts. During summer seasons, it rises sharply to around 20,000 to 22,000 megawatts.

Major Solar Energy Plan

To meet this growing demand, the Government of Tamil Nadu is implementing a massive ₹70,000 crore project to generate 20,000 megawatts of electricity through solar energy by the year 2030.

Key Highlights

Current Situation

- Average electricity demand: 19,000 MW
- Summer peak demand: 20,000–22,000 MW

Future Outlook

- Power demand is expected to double between 2026–27 and 2036–37.

Renewable Energy Goal

- Generate 20,000 MW through solar power by 2030
- Total investment: ₹70,000 crore

Additional Power Purchase

Along with improving local production, electricity is also being purchased from private companies to manage shortages when needed.
